Order No. 03 dated 25.03.2021

The petitioners namely, Lopamudra Roy and Kaushik Roy are present before the Court along with their Id. Advocates.

Before proceeding with the hearing of the application u/s 13B of Hindu Marriage Act, the case record is taken up for reconciliation. This court took its best endeavour to reconcile the dispute between them, but parties are too arrogant to settle the dispute between them. Hence, reconciliation fails.

Now, the petition u/s 13B of Hindu Marriage Act is taken up for hearing.

Both the petitioners have filed their respective evidence in chief on affidavit as P.W.1 and P.W. 2 respectively.

On careful perusal of the respective evidence in chief of the petitioners and also the application u/s 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, following vital facts are disclosed –

1/ The marriage between the petitioners has been solemnized on 11.10.2018 according to Hindu rites and customs ;

2/ Both the petitioners are living separately since 10.04.2019;

3/ The instant application u/s 13B of Hindu Marriage Act has not been presented collusively and both the petitioners have filed the instant application voluntarily without being induced by anyone.

So, after considering the above-mentioned vital facts, I am satisfied to hold that the conditions, mentioned in the application u/s 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, are valid and bona fide one and accordingly the application u/s 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act is hereby accepted.

C.F. paid is correct.

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Hence, it is,

Ordered,

that the Mat. Suit be and the same is decreed on consent in favour of the petitioners, but without any order as to costs.

The marriage tie between the parties, namely, Lopamudra Roy and Kaushik Roy solemnized on 11.10.2018 according to Hindu rites and customs, is hereby dissolved on mutual consent with effect from this day.

Let a copy of this order be supplied to each of the parties free of cost as per provision of section 23(4) of Hindu Marriage Act.
