This original petition came up on 03.02.2026 for final hearing before me in the presence of **Sri K.V.N.Kama Sastri and Sri.K.Ravindra**, learned Advocates for petitioners, upon hearing the learned counsel for the petitioners, petitioners in person and upon perusal of the material on record, having stood over for consideration till this day, this Court delivered the following:

ORDER

1. This is the petition filed under section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 seeking the relief of dissolution of marriage inter-se the petitioners by passing a decree of divorce by mutual consent.

2. **The nub of the petition is that:**

(i) the petitioners got married on 23.05.2010 i.e., at the early hours of 24.05.2010 at T.T.D Kalyana Mandapam in Penugonda as per Hindu

religious rites and their caste customs and their marriage was consummated, but, no children were born to them.

(ii) After the marriage, both the petitioners lived together for ten years happily, thereafter, misunderstandings cropped up in between them, they started quarreling frequently and developed a sort of dislike against each other. Subsequently, during December 2021, the 2nd petitioner went to her parents' house, since then both the petitioners have been living separately. The attempts to unite both of them by their parents and relatives became futile.

(iii) All the monetary claims were already settled in between the parties and there are no disputes or claims in that regard. The 2nd petitioner agreed not to put forward any claim for maintenance or permanent alimony. She has given up her claim for maintenance or permanent alimony. As there is no possibility for reunion, they filed this petition.

3. In substantiation of the contention of the petitioners, they are examined themselves as P.W.1 and P.W.2 and deposed through their chief evidence affidavits and got exhibited Exts.P.1 to Exts.P.4.

4. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the petitioners in person. Perused the material on record and bestowed my thoughtful consideration for the argument advanced by the learned counsel for the petitioners.

5. **Now the point for determination is:**

Whether this petition can be allowed by dissolving the marriage in between the petitioners by mutual consent?

6. **:Point:**

(i) In substantiation of the contention of the petitioners, they are examined themselves as P.W.1 and P.W.2 by reaffirming the contents of the petition and their testimonies are remained unchallenged. On perusal

of the evidence available on record, this court is satisfied about the bonafide consent of the parties. Since, there is no possibility for reunion, it is just and proper to accede their request. Accordingly, this point is answered.

In the result, this petition is **allowed**, by **dissolving the marriage** in between the petitioners solemnized on **23.05.2010 i.e., at the early hours of 24.05.2010** by way of granting decree of divorce by mutual consent under section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955. In the facts and circumstances of the case no order as to the costs.
