This petition is coming before me on 16.03.2026 for disposal in the presence of the learned counsel for the petitioner M/s.B.Venkatesan, V.Babu, B.Samsudeen learned counsels for petitioner, Assistant Public Prosecutor Grade-I for the respondent and upon perusing the documents and having stood over for consideration till this date, this court made the following,

Order

1. The instant bail application has been filed under Section 478 of BNSS Act of 2023 by the Petitioner/accused in Cr.No.54/2026. The Petitioner surrendered on 16.03.2026 for the alleged offences under Section 296(b), 115(2), 351(2) BNS Act.

2. While so, it is the case of the Petitioner/Accused that the accused is innocent and has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. Further, there is no prima facie documents on record to substantiate that the petitioner/accused was

involved in the alleged offence. Hence, there is no reason for the Petitioner to abscond or tamper with the witnesses if he is enlarged on bail. If the Petitioner/accused are released on bail, he is ready to produce substantial sureties to the satisfaction of this Court.

3. Heard. This Court has perused all the documents and records. On careful consideration of the Petition and relevant materials on records, this Court finds that the Petitioner surrendered before this court on the apprehension of arrest in Cr.No.54/2026. On perusal of records, it is found that the offences alleged against the accused under Section 296(b), 115(2), 351(2) BNS Act are bailable offences.

4. Hence this court is inclined to grant bail to the Petitioner with the following conditions:-

1) The Petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail subject to the execution of a bond for Rs.10,000/- each (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) and also furnishing two sureties for a like sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) to the satisfaction of this court.

2) The sureties are directed to signature and thumb impression and produce a photocopy of their permanent ID proof.

3) The Petitioner is directed not to alter or tamper the witnesses.

4) The Petitioner shall not abscond, involve in any illegal activities in the future and he is directed to co-operate with the investigation.
