This petition coming up for hearing before me on 05.03.2026 and upon perusing the material papers and records and upon hearing the arguments of M/s.V.R.Bharath and R.Sathish Kumar, Learned counsel for the petitioners/accused and Mr.K.J.Saravanan, Learned Special Public Prosecutor for respondent/complainant, this court doth make the following:-

**ORDER**

This petition filed U/s.483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 praying to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

2. Heard. Records perused. The petitioner is the 4<sup>th</sup> accused in Crime No.284/2025 of F1.Gummidipoondi P.S. He alleged to have committed the offence u/s. 8(c) r/w 22(C) and 29(1) of the NDPS Act. A1 to A5 including this petitioner/A4 had been detained in prison on 14.12.2025. A6 had been detained in prison on 17.12.2025 and subsequently other accused had been detained in prison on 10.01.2026. Now the petitioner/Accused has come forward with the present petition

to enlarge him on bail. According to the case of the prosecution, the petitioner/Accused along with co-accused had possessed 56 grams of Methamphetamine, 58 numbers of MDMA weighed 25 grams and 25 numbers of LSD Stamps weighed 0.37 grams for sale and the same had been seized by the respondent police. It has been urged that the petitioner is innocent and he had been falsely implicated in the case. The learned counsel for the petitioners had submitted that the petitioner is innocent and he is in no way connected in this case and no contraband had been recovered from this petitioner and only based on confession of co-accused, this petitioner had been falsely implicated in the case and he is ready to abide any condition imposed by this court. This is stated to be the **first** bail application before this court and no similar petition is pending before the Hon'ble High Court / any other court. The learned Special Public Prosecutor would submit that the seized contraband is of commercial quantity and the investigation of this case is in initial stage. It has been putforth that if he is enlarged on bail, he would abscond and may commit similar offence and tamper the witnesses. The contraband involved is of commercial quantity and hence the rigors of section 37 of the NDPS Act would arise in granting bail. He putforth the possibility of abscondence of the petitioner/accused if ever released on bail. Perusal of records would show that quantity of the contraband recovered is obviously commercial quantity. Prima facie complicity of the accused is established. No reason to believe that the petitioner/accused is not guilty of the offence and unlikely to commit any offence while on bail. The petitioner/accused has not satisfied the twin condition required under section 37 of the NDPS Act. Though the learned counsel for the petitioner/A4 would urge that no contraband had been recovered from this petitioner/A4, it is shown to be a concerted action among all the accused and all the accused persons were jointly at the spot. Perusal of reply filed by the respondent police and submission by the learned Special Public Prosecutor would show that the investigation of the case is in the initial stage. Here the investigation is in the nascent

stage. The release of the petitioner/Accused at this stage would hamper the investigation. Hence this court is not inclined to allow the present petition.

In the result, this petition is dismissed.
