Ist Application for Grant of Regular Bail u/s 483 of BNSS, 2023

ORDER:-

Prayer in this application under Section 483 of Bharatiya
Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (for brevity BNSS) is for grant of regular
bail to the petitioner–Krishan Lal, who has been booked for having

committed the offences punishable under Sections 920 (b) (ii) (C) 25, 29 of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (hereinafter referred to as 'NDPS Act') in a case arising out of FIR No.290 dated 05.08.2025 registered at Police Station Barauda, District Sonipat.

2. In nut-shell, the allegations are that on 05.08.2025 police team headed by ASI Manoj Kumar and ASI Pardeep apprehended accused Gulab Singh and Parkash in conscious possession of *Charas* weighing 4 kilogram 527 grams without requisite license or permit. In their disclosure statements, the name of accused-petitioner-Krishan Lal surfaced, against whom Section 29 of NDPS Act was attracted. He is in custody since 10.08.2025.

3. Learned counsel for petitioner submits, inter-alia, that the petitioner has been framed in this case and except the disclosure statements of co-accused, there is no incriminating material against him. After completion of investigation, the final report has already been presented and the trial is likely to take considerable time.

4. On the other hand, the learned Public Prosecutor opposes the application contending that the rigours of Section 37 of the NDPS Act are clearly attracted.

5. Arguments addressed by learned counsels for both the sides have been fully appraised and the material on case file has been carefully examined.

6. The petitioner Krishan Lal has been accused of having

committed the offence punishable under Section 29 of the NDPS Act, against whom another case FIR No.160/2025 under Sections 20, 29 of NDPS Act has also been registered at Police Station Barauda. He has failed to make out the case for granting of bail attracting rigours of Section 37 of the NDPS Act. Mere length of incarceration is no ground for bail, particularly to see the severity of the crime. The apprehension of the learned Public Prosecutor that the petitioner, if released on bail, is likely to abscond or hamper the trial, is not unfounded to see the punishment the offence entails.

7. Having regard to the nature and severity of the crime, and at this stage, without commenting on the merits of the case, I do not find fit and appropriate to grant bail to the petitioner-accused. Hence, this application for bail is dismissed. Papers be tagged with the main file.
