This petition is coming on this day before this court for hearing in the presence of M/s. P. Muthamizh Selvakumar, A. Esakipandy, A. Aravindraj, K. Sarath Kumar, the counsel for the petitioner and of the SPP for the respondents and upon hearing them, this Court delivered the following

ORDER

1. The petitioner is facing charges before this court for the offences punishable u/s. 191(2), 191(3), 118(1), 103, 351(3) r/w. 61(2), 49, 238 of BNS and Sec.4(b) r/w. 5 of Explosive Substance Act 1908 and Sec.25(1)(A) of Arms Act.

2. The petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 06.07.2024. The petitioner has now come up with the present application seeking for bail on medical grounds.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is a Diabetic for about 6 years. The petitioner used to strictly follow the diet prescribed by the Doctors and has to undergo regular check-up of the Liver, Kidney and Heart every 6 months. The petitioner is in custody for about 19 months and none of the medical examination have been done. The petitioner suffered with high abdominal pain and though he approached the Prison authorities for treatment, that was not provided. As per the order of this court, the petitioner was taken to Government Stanley Hospital and he was advised diagnosed with a calculus measuring about 3.3MM in the inter police of right kidney and suggested with clinical correlation. Therefore, the learned counsel for the petitioner prays for bail on medical grounds.

3. Per contra, the learned SPP has submitted that the petitioner was provided with proper medical treatment in the Prison as well as outside the hospital whenever it is necessary. The learned SPP has submitted that on 01.06.2026, the petitioner suffered with a heart attack and he was taken to the Government Stanley Medical College Hospital. On 02.06.2026, the Coronary Angiogram was done and found that he was suffered from Triple Vessel Disease (SYNTAX - 24). Immediately, he was admitted in the Intensive Care Unit and was given proper treatment. Now that the petitioner is stable. The learned SPP has submitted that the petitioner will be discharged from the hospital on 08.06.2026. Therefore, according to learned SPP, the request of bail on medical grounds has to be declined.

4. This court has given its thoughtful consideration to the rival submissions put forth by either side. The petitioner was arrested on 06.07.2024 in connection with murder of Mr. Armstrong, State President of Bahujan Samaj Party and he is in incarceration since then. On careful perusal of the records, it is found that the petitioner is a chronic Diabetic Type II patient and having health issues relating to the same. The petitioner has approached this court by way of CrI.M.P.No.49/2026 seeking for property medical treatment at Government Stanley Hospital, Chennai. This court by its order dated 25.03.2026 by relying upon the decision of "the Hon'ble Madurai Branch of High Court of Madras in M. Kalaiselvi Vs. State of Tamil Nadu rep. by the Deputy Inspector General of Prisons", directed the Superintendent of

Prison to provide necessary medical treatment to the petitioner and if necessary co-ordinate with the respondent police for necessary escort arrangements. Accordingly, the petitioner was given treatment on and off in the private hospital as well as in the Govt. Stanley Hospital. From the Medical Report submitted by the learned SPP, it is found that the petitioner has suffered a Cardiac arrest on 01.06.2026 and therefore, he was taken to Govt. Stanley Hospital and was given life saving medicines. On 02.06.2026, the Coronary Angiogram was done and it is found that the petitioner was suffered with Triple Vessel Disease (SYNTAX - 24). The report reveals that the present condition of the petitioner is stable and he can be discharged on 08.06.2026. However, it is also observed in the medical report that the petitioner has to continue the medicines prescribed and has to admit in the hospital after a month for ongoing CABG(Bypass surgery). Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has sufficient means and he is ready to undergo surgery in a private hospital. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that since the petitioner being a Diabetic, he has to follow strict diet and the medications prescribed. Therefore, according to the learned counsel for the petitioner, the Prison is not conducive for his proper treatment, care and support. Considering the serious health condition of the petitioner, this court is inclined to grant him interim bail for about 2 months for the purpose of taking medical treatment as well as to undergo CABG in any private hospital of his choice. Accordingly, the petition is allowed on the following conditions.

5. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on interim bail for 2 months on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees twenty five thousand only) with two sureties, each for a likesum to the satisfaction of the this court and on further condition that

(a) the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

(b) during the bail, the petitioner shall appear before this court on the hearing dates unless he is hospitalized.

(c) that the petitioner shall surrender before this court on 06.08.2026 at 10.30 a.m.
