



Cri.Bail Application No.1547/2025

(Vishal Arun Raikwad Vs. The State)

ORDER BELOW EXH.1

(Passed on 4th October, 2025)

1. The applicant is seeking the relief of pre-arrest bail in connection with Crime no. 646/2025, MIDC Police Station registered on dated 25.08.2025 under Sections 316(4), 318(4) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

2. As per FIR, it is alleged against the applicant that he was working as customer adviser in Tata Motors Showroom, MIDC. It is further alleged against him that in between 28.03.2025 to 20.06.2025 he committed breach of trust and cheated the informant by obtaining the purchase amount Rs.3,81,000/- of the vehicle in his account from the customers.

3. At the time of argument, the learned advocate for the applicant argued that the applicant has not committed any offence and he is falsely implicated in the said offence. There is delay of more than two months to lodge the FIR. He further argued that, there was difficulty in transferring the amount to the bank account of the showroom, hence, the complainant himself requested to the present applicant to take the said booking amount in his bank account and thereafter withdraw the same. There is nothing to be recovered as per the story of prosecution itself and therefore the custodial interrogation of the applicant is not necessary.

4. The prosecution has availed sufficient opportunity but failed to file its reply. The learned APP submitted that the accused has committed

serious offence. He has misappropriated the amount of the showroom. Hence, he prayed to reject the application.

5. Perused case papers and FIR. It is seen that there is nothing to be recovered from the applicant and hence his custodial interrogation is not seen to be necessary. In such circumstances, the applicant is entitled for bail. Hence, the following order.

ORDER

1. The application is allowed.
2. In the event of arrest, the applicant be released on anticipatory bail on his executing P.R. Bond of Rs.15,000/- (Rs.Fifteen thousand only) with one surety in the like amount.
3. The applicant shall not tamper with the prosecution witnesses, in any manner.
4. The applicant shall remain present before the concern police station on every Wednesday in between 4.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. for the period of one month from today.
5. Inform to the concern police station accordingly.
