This petition came before this Court for final hearing today in the presence of Thiru.N.Prabhakaran, the learned Counsel for the petitioner and of Thiru.R.Udhayanithi, In-Charge for the learned Public Prosecutor for the respondent and heard either side and on perusing all the records, this Court delivered the following.....

ORDER

1. The petition is filed U/S.483 of BNSS 2023 seeking bail.

2. Nitty-Gritty of the prosecution case is as follows :-

On 04.05.2026 at 01.30 P.M. at Chathirapatti Vels Car consulting office, the petitioner abused the complainant in filthy language and attacked her with hands. Further he intimidated her with dire consequences. Therefore, case registered against the petitioner U/s 296(b), 329(4), 115(2), 74 and 351(2) of B.N.S. Act,2023 and Sec.4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Woman (Amendment) Act,2002.

3. The prosecution filed objection. Heard both sides.

4. The point for determination is that can bail be granted to the petitioner?

5. Answer :-

First Information Report would show that already illicit relationship was existing between the complainant and petitioner. Further as submitted by the prosecution, the injured person was discharged from the hospital. The petitioner is permanent abode in his locality. Having considered the above facts and duration of custody suffered by the petitioner in Jail, I inclined to release the petitioner on conditional bail.

6. Ideo, it is ordered that the petitioner shall be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.15,000/- with two sureties each for like sum. The following conditions are imposed upon the petitioner.

1. The petitioner shall appear in person before the SHO, Chathirapatti Police station daily at 10.00 A.M. and 5.00 P.M. for a period of 30 days and thereafter shall appear before the Investigating Officer as and when required.
2. The petitioner shall not contact the prosecution witnesses either directly or through electronic medium.
3. The petitioner shall furnish his mobile phone number and his residential address by filling affidavit before Court.
4. If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation Officer is within his discretion to approach the Court concerned for cancellation of bail as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme court reported in P.K.Shaji/Vs/State of Kerala, (2005)AIR S.C.W.5560.
