Petition dated 16.07.2026 through e-filed and U/s. 483 of BNSS seeks Custody bail to the petitioner/accused.

This petition came before this Court for final hearing today in the presence of Thiru.K.Sakthivel Rajan, the learned Counsel for the petitioner and of Thiru.T.Sivachandran, the learned Public Prosecutor for the respondent and heard either side and on perusing all the records, this Court delivered the following.....

ORDER

1. The petitioner/ accused (A1) seeks bail for the alleged offences U/s 8(c), 20(b)(ii)(A), and 25 of NDPS Act and 25(1)(a) of Arms Act.
2. The Prosecution case is that the defacto complainant is S.I. of Police attached to the respondent P.S., that on 03.07.2026 at 18.30 hours on reliable information received by him, he along with police party made on surveillance and done vehicle inspection nearby Union Office situated at Anaipatti – Nilakottai main road, on seeing the police party, the petitioner and co-accused try to escape, but the respondent police surrounded them and made search, they seized 100 grams of cannabis and big sword from the accused, hence the case.
3. The learned Counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner did not involve in this case incident as alleged by prosecution; false case has been foisted against the petitioner; that the petitioner is undergoing incarceration from 04.07.2026; if he is released on bail, he will abide the conditions of this Court and that he may be released on bail.

4. On the other hand, learned Public Prosecutor contended that investigation is pending; petitioner has already involved in 7 previous case incidents, out of which one case is under section 3 of TNPPDL Act and SC/ST Act; if the accused is released on bail, he will commit the similar nature offence again and that the petition may be dismissed.

5. Upon hearing both side argument and on perusal of FIR contents, it is seen that the accused was in 100 grams of cannabis and and big sword. It is objected on Prosecution that 7 previous cases are reported against the accused.

6. Considering the nature of offence, bad antecedents of the petitioner/accused and in the interest of Justice, this Court is not inclined to release the petitioner/accused on bail at this stage.

In the result, bail petition is dismissed.
