O R D E R

1. The **petitioner, Rinki Kumari**, who has been in judicial custody since 25.05.2026, seeks grant of bail in connection with **Beur P.S. Case No. 200/2024**, registered for offences punishable under Sections 406, 420, 504, and 506 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.
2. Heard Sri Mukund Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioner and Sri Rajesh Kumar, learned Public Prosecutor for the State.
3. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner, along with co-accused Shailesh Kumar, was earlier granted anticipatory bail vide order dated 20.05.2024 passed in A.B.P. No. 1886 of 2024. However, the petitioner failed to comply with the conditions imposed therein. Subsequently, **the petitioner approached the Hon'ble Patna High Court in Cr. Misc. No. 67862 of 2024, which was allowed subject to certain conditions. It is contended that the petitioner again failed to comply with the conditions stipulated in the said order.**
4. Prosecution case briefly put is that the petitioner, owner of land which is subject matter of sale in the instant police case agreed with the informant Tanuja Kumari to sell a piece of land details of which has been stated in the agreement to sell dated 09.05.2023 annexed with this anticipatory bail application for a total consideration amount of Rs.73,50,000/-.
5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has consistently acknowledged her liability towards the informant and is willing to make payment of the outstanding amount. It is further submitted that the petitioner has already paid a sum of Rs. 15,00,000/- and was unable to arrange the remaining amount due to her arrest, which prevented her from selling her land. It is also contended that the petitioner has no criminal antecedent.
6. Learned Public Prosecutor opposes the prayer for grant of bail to the

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petitioner. He submits that the petitioner was granted anticipatory bail by this Court vide order dated 20.05.2024 in A.B.P. No. 1886 of 2024, subject to the condition that she would pay 40% of the total amount of Rs. 64,00,000/-, i.e., Rs. 25,60,000/-, to the informant at the time of furnishing bail bonds through a demand draft. The remaining amount of Rs. 38,40,000/- was to be paid in five equal monthly installments of Rs. 7,68,000/- each during the first week of five consecutive months. However, the petitioner failed to comply with these conditions.

7. It is further submitted that the **petitioner was again granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble Patna High Court vide order dated 15.05.2025 in Cr. Misc. No. 67862 of 2024, with a direction to pay Rs. 59,00,000/- in six equal monthly installments. Despite such relief, the petitioner did not comply with the order of the Hon'ble Patna High Court. It is also contended that the petitioner deliberately failed to appear before the court concerned, resulting in issuance of a Non-Bailable Warrant (NBW), pursuant to which she was arrested. Such conduct, according to the prosecution, reflects a clear disregard for the order of Hon'ble Patna High Court.**
8. Having regard to the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the above named petitioner. Accordingly, this bail application is ***rejected***.
