Petition dated: 01.06.2026 filed U/s.483 BNSS to grant bail.

This petition is coming on this day for hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.T.Ganesan, Advocate for the petitioner and Thiru.M.Arutchelvan, the Public Prosecutor for the respondent and upon hearing both sides arguments, this Court passed the following :

ORDER

The Petitioner/A1 was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 14.04.2026 for the alleged offence u/s.304(2) of BNS, registered by respondent police, seeks bail.

The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner has submitted that this is the second bail petition, the petitioner is a college student studying E.E.E. in Sree Krishna College of Technology, Coimbatore and this is the false case registered against the petitioner and he was no way connected with the alleged offence and further the petitioner is undergoing incarceration for the past 50 days and prayed to grant bail to the petitioner subject to any conditions.

The learned Public Prosecutor has submitted that when the defacto complainant along with their family went to Kodiveri Dam for taking a bath, the petitioner along with other accused snatched 6 sovereign gold chain from the defacto complainant. Hence, a case was registered and the property was secured.

Heard. Records perused. On perusal of records, it reveals that this is the second bail petition and the date of occurrence took place on 02.10.2025. As per the case of prosecution, the petitioner along with other accused have snatched six sovereign of gold chain from the defacto complainant. The properties were secured. It is the contention of the petitioner that the petitioner is a college student studying E.E.E. at Sree Krishna College of Technology, Coimbatore and the petitioner is ready to abide by any condition as imposed by the court and hence the bail may be granted. Further, it is contended by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner along with his mother and brother came to Coimbatore from Mayiladuthurai on 02.10.2025 and hence no such occurrence took place on 02.10.2025. In the above circumstances, considering the nature of offence and the facts and circumstances of the case, considering the submission of the petitioner, the property was recovered, the material part of investigation might have been completed by this time and also the period of custody undergone by the petitioner, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner herein subject to following conditions.

- i) that the petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail on executing his bond for **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties, for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Gobichettipalayam;
- ii) that the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or Bank pass book to ensure their identity;
- iii) **that the petitioner shall report and sign before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Gobichettipalayam daily at 10.30 a.m., for 15 working days and then he shall report and sign before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Gobichettipalayam, twice a month i.e. 1st and 15th day of every month at 10.30 a.m., until further orders and further if 1st and 15th**

day of the month is a holiday, petitioner shall report on the next working day of the court and on further condition that he shall make available himself for interrogation as and when required by the investigation officer;

- iv) that the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;
- v) that the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial ;
- vi) that on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/trial court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme court in P.K.Shaji -vs- State of Kerala ((2005) AIR SCW 5560);
- vii) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered U/s 269 BNS.
