Petition dated: 01.06.2026 filed U/s.482 BNSS to grant anticipatory bail.

This petition is coming on this day for hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.K.Navamani, Advocate for the petitioner and Thiru.M.Arutchelvan, the Public Prosecutor for the respondent and upon hearing both sides arguments, this Court passed the following :

ORDER

The Petitioner/A2 seeks anticipatory bail for the alleged offences under Section 303(2) of BNS, registered by the respondent police.

The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that co accused A1 was released on bail by the trial court, the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and he has not committed any such offence as alleged by the prosecution, the petitioner is in imminent danger of being arrested by the respondent police and the petitioner is ready to appear before the respondent police for interrogation and prays to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner subject to any conditions.

The learned Public Prosecution has submitted that while respondent police conducted inspection near Pidariyur Kovilpalayam Pririvu, Chennimalai to Perundurai Raod, they found that the petitioner along with other accused were involved in illegal transportation of 3 units of Gravel sand in the Tipper lorry bearing registration No.TN 38 AV 6525 without appropriate permit. Hence, a case was registered. Further he submitted that the properties were secured.

Heard both sides. Records perused. On persual of records, it shows that the occurrence took place on 30.05.2026. As per the case of prosecution, the petitioner along with other accused were involved in illegal transportation of 3 units of Gravel sand in the Tipper lorry bearing registration No.TN 38 AV 6525 without appropriate permit. Properties were secured. Co accused A1 was released on bail by the trial court. In the above circumstances, considering the fact that the properties were secured, co accused A1 was released on bail by the trial court and also material part of the investigation might have been completed by this time, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner herein subject to following conditions.

- i) that in the event of arrest of the petitioner by the respondent/police or on his surrender before the court of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Perundurai within 15 days from the date of this order and on such arrest or surrender the petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on anticipatory bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Perundurai;
- ii) that the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity;
- iii) **that the petitioner shall report and sign before the respondent police daily at 10.00 a.m., for Two Weeks and then he shall report and sign before the respondent police twice a month i.e on 1st and 15th day of every month at 10.00 a.m., until further orders** and on further condition that he shall make available himself for interrogation as and when required by the investigation officer;

- iv) that the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;
- v) that the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;
- vi) that on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/trial court himself, as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme court in P.K.Shaji -vs- State of Kerala ((2005) AIR SCW 5560);
- vii) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered U/s 269 BNS.
