This petition has been filed on 20.10.2021 and came up for final hearing before this court on 21.07.2026 in the presence of Advocates Thiru.S.Sathishkumar for Petitioners, Thiru.C.Subramanian for 2nd respondent, Thiru.P.C.Ayyappan for 3rd respondent and 1st Respondent called absent and set exparte. Heard the arguments of both, Perusing the case records and having stood over for consideration till this day, this tribunal delivers the following.

ORDER

1. This petition is filed by the petitioners under Section 166 of M.V Act claiming compensation of Rs.50,00,000/- for the death of deceased Senthilkumar in the road accident on 29.07.2019.

2. Brief averments of the petition:-

On 29.07.2019 at 12.00 PM while the deceased Senthilkumar driven his Bajaj CT 100 Motor cycle bearing Registration No.TN 39 CZ 5024 along Kunnathur to Perundurai main road, from West to East direction at a moderate speed and cautious manner, adhering the traffic rules and while nearing Thirupathi Rice Mill, Malaiseendapuram divider a Bolero Pick up bearing Registration No. TN 56 B 3173 driven by 1st respondent came from East to West direction, in a rash and negligent manner, without adhering the traffic rules and regulations, suddenly dashed against the deceased vehicle from opposite side and caused an accident. Due to forcible impact, the deceased fell down on the road and sustained multiple grievous injuries and multiple bone fractures and head injury, which resulted in death of deceased. Hence, the accident took place only due to rash and negligent driving of the vehicle by 1st respondent. The deceased was aged 38 years and was working in power loom at Perundurai and earning Rs.30,000/- per month. Petitioners are the Sisters of the deceased and they are dependents on the income of the deceased.

The 1st respondent is the driver, 2nd respondent is owner and 3rd respondent is the insurer of the Bolero pick up vehicle bearing Registration No.TN 56 B 3173 and as such the respondents are jointly and severally liable to pay compensation to the petitioners.

3. The brief averments of the counter filed by 2nd respondent read as follows:

The petition is not sustainable. The age, occupation, monthly income of the deceased and manner of the accident stated by the petitioners are denied as false and incorrect. The accident took place only due to the rash

and negligent act of deceased. The vehicle was insured with 3rd respondent and 1st respondent also possess valid driving license. As per the terms of the policy the 3rd respondent is liable to indemnify the 2nd respondent in respect of compensation payable to the petitioners.

4. The brief averments of the counter and additional counter filed by 3rd respondent read as follows:

The petition is not sustainable. The age, occupation, monthly income of the deceased and manner of the accident stated by the petitioners are denied as false and incorrect. The 1st respondent or the 2nd respondent have not informed about the accident. The FIR was registered against unknown vehicle on the complaint of One Karthikeyan. Subsequently the first informant, petitioners after due deliberation and consultation, colluding with the respondents 1 and 2 have manipulated the records with the assistance of the police. The police had filed final report against 1st respondent without proper investigation. The vehicle involved in the accident was planted for the reasons best known. The deceased was not possessed with driving licence and wore helmet at the time of accident. The deceased sustained injuries due to some other manner and the same was tainted with unclear facts. The petitioners are entitled to workout their remedy against claims enquiry officer where the accident has taken place for the claim under solatium scheme. There is no merits in the petition and prays for dismissal.

5. Points for consideration:

a) Whether the Motor accident occurred on account of rash and negligent driving of the Bolero pick up bearing Registration No.TN 56 B 3173 by 1st Respondent ?

- b) Whether the deceased had contributed for the accident is true?
- c) Whether the petitioners are entitled to get any compensation?
- d) Who is liable to pay compensation?
- e) What is the quantum of compensation that the petitioners are entitled to?

6. To prove the case of the petitioners, the 1st petitioner was examined as PW1 and Ex.P1 to P9 was marked. One Gopal was examined as RW1 and Ex.R1 series was marked.

7. The oral and documentary evidence produced in the case were perused and Arguments advanced on either side were heard.

8. **Point No.1 and 2**

It is the case of petitioners while the deceased Senthilkumar was moving in the two-wheeler on Kunnathur to Perundurai road, from West to East, the Bolero vehicle which proceeded from East to West dashed the two-wheeler driven by the deceased and caused an accident resulting his death. FIR was originally registered against unknown vehicle. In the FIR it is mentioned that an unknown vehicle which came in the opposite direction from West to East was driven by its driver rash and negligently dashed the motorist and caused the accident. The first informant Karthikeyan is not an eye witness to the accident. As per FIR his statement is hearsay in nature. In the FIR also there is no mention about the type of vehicle whether it is a two-wheeler, car, bus, truck, goods vehicle, light motor vehicle or any other vehicle by its classification. The informant in the FIR had also not disclosed by whom he received information regarding the accident. The FIR was registered on 29.07.2019. The complaint was lodged within one hour from

the time of accident. Ex.P2 and Ex.P3 are the observation mahazar and rough sketch regarding the accident. The petitioners have not examined any eye witness regarding the accident. The petitioners would rely upon the police records and final report filed by the police. In the final report filed by the Police One Saravanan and Marimuthu were cited as eye witness. As per the charge sheet Ex.P6 the driver involved in the accident was one Boopathy and he was arrested on 31.07.2019 that is two days after the accident and enlarged on bail. The MVI report shows the vehicle involved in the accident were subjected for inspection on 31.07.2019. In the MVI report the damages to the two-wheeler is on the front head light and indicator assembly, speedometer, handle bar, front wheel mudguard, petrol tank, right side foot rest damaged. The damages to the Bolero vehicle as per Ex.P5 is on the rear side right break light assembly, right side diesel tank cover, right side rear wheel sanny mudguard damaged. As per Rough sketch the accident is said to have taken place on the extreme left side of the Kunnathur – Perundurai road. The deceased was proceeding from West to East and the Bolero vehicle is said to be proceeding from East to West. The width of the road is approximately 40 feet as per the Rough sketch. The accident has taken place on the Northern side of the road. The petitioners have stated the Bolero vehicle which came in the opposite direction had dashed the two-wheeler. The petitioners have filed the claim under Section 166 of Motor vehicles Act. The petitioners by producing the final report has established the 1st respondent has caused the accident. Though the petitioners have taken steps to examine the eye witness cited in the charge sheet, they were not subjected to the process of Court as they have left the place of residence as mentioned in the charge sheet. As such the non examination of the eye witness by petitioners cannot be stated that the

petitioners have failed to prove the claim. The 3rd respondent insurer has filed counter disputing the involvement of vehicle and the manner of accident. Though the 3rd respondent has taken steps to examine the investigating officer to probablize their stand regarding non involvement of the vehicle, how the driver was arrested, damages to the vehicle, etc., the witness has not turned up inspite of summons and the evidence of 3rd respondent was closed with the examination of RW1. As such the contention of 3rd respondent in his counter regarding the non involvement of vehicle was also not probablized. Accordingly on the basis of documents and materials the tribunal is of view the accident has taken place due to the negligence of 1st respondent and point No.1 is answered in affirmative and point No.2 is answered in negative.

9. **Point No.3**

As stated earlier the deceased Senthilkumar sustained multiple injuries in the accident and he died on the same day. Postmortem was done on the person of the deceased as per Ex.P7 which shows the death of the deceased is due to shock and haemorrhage as a result of multiple injuries. The deceased was aged 38 years as per Ex.P8 death certificate. Postmortem certificate also shows his age as 38 years. The petitioners are the Sisters of deceased as per Ex.P9 legal heirship certificate. Accordingly the point is answered.

10. **Point No.4**

The 1st respondent is driver, 2nd respondent is owner and 3rd respondent is the insurer of the Bolero pick up bearing Registration No.TN 56 B 3173 at the time of accident. The MVI report of the vehicle was

produced as Ex.P5. The details of vehicle and policy particulars was not disputed. As per Ex.P5 1st respondent was possessed with valid driving license and there was no violation of policy or registration certificate conditions. The deceased is third party as regard 2nd respondent vehicle is concerned. The 3rd respondent being the insurer is liable to indemnify the 2nd respondent in respect of compensation payable to the petitioners. The liability of the respondents 1 to 3 are joint and several.

11. Point No.5

The Honourable Apex court in the Judgment of **Sarla verma and others /Vs/ Delhi Transport Corporation and another (2009 (6) SCC 121)** and **National Insurance company ltd., /Vs/ Pranaysethi and others (AIR 2017 Supreme court 5157)** has laid down guidelines for assessment of compensation in a case of this nature. In **Sarla verma and others /Vs/ Delhi Transport Corporation and another (2009 (6) SCC 121)** it has been held basically 3 facts need to be established by the claimants for assessing compensation in case of death and they are **A) Age of the deceased, B) Income of the deceased and C) The number of dependents** and the issues to be determined by the tribunal to arrive at the loss of dependency are **1) The additions/Deductions to be made for arriving at the income, 2) The deduction to be made towards personal and living expenses of the deceased, 3) The multiplier to be applied with reference to the age of the deceased.** Keeping these guidelines in mind this tribunal proceeds to assess the loss of dependency.

In the petition the petitioners have stated the age of the deceased as 38 years. The death certificate and postmortem certificate shows the age of the deceased as 38 years. Accordingly the age of the deceased is fixed as 38

years. The petitioners have pleaded the deceased was working in power loom at Perundurai and earning Rs.30,000/- per month. However no details regarding the details of the employer of deceased, place of employment was not given in the petition. The petitioners have also not examined any witness regarding the nature of work and earnings of the deceased.

The petitioners are the Sisters of deceased. The petitioners are grownup, married long before and it is admitted they are residing with their husband and family at their matrimonial home. It is also admitted by the petitioners the deceased was living separately. The petitioners in their chief examination have stated if the deceased was alive he could have arranged financial assistance and the petitioners have lost the love and affection due to the death of deceased. From the evidence of petitioners it is clear the petitioners are not the dependents on the income of the deceased. PW1 has also admitted that her husband and the husband of 2nd petitioner are employed and working in Textile. The petitioners have failed to prove that they are dependents on the income of the deceased subsequent to their marriage. It is needless to mention that once a daughter is married, she gets financial support from her husband. The petitioners have not proved that the deceased was providing financial support to the petitioners during his life time. Though the petitioners may be legal representatives of the deceased, the petitioners are not entitled for loss of dependency unless it is shown that they were financially dependent on the deceased Brother. As such the income of the deceased does not requires consideration and this court on the facts of the case is of view, the petitioners are entitled only for compensation on the head of loss of estate, loss of consortium, funeral expenses and transportation expenses.

a) Loss of estate, Loss of consortium and funeral expenses

The Honorable Apex court in **National Insurance Company limited /Vs/ Pranaysethi and others** has held that under the conventional heads namely loss of estate and funeral expenses a sum of **Rs.15,000/-** and **Rs.15,000/-** respectively be awarded. The petitioners being the Sisters of the deceased would have lost the love throughout their life and lost the love the deceased would have shown to them and he would have got from them and as such the petitioners are each entitled to **Rs.40,000/-** towards consortium and accordingly the same is awarded.

b)Transportation expenses

After the accident the deceased was taken to Erode Government Medical College Hospital, Perundurai and after postmortem taken to the house and burial ground. Therefore in this respect the petitioners would have incurred expenses towards transportation and thus a sum of **Rs.10,000/-** is awarded towards transportation expenses.

1. Loss of consortium	-	Rs. 80,000 /-
2. Loss of estate	-	Rs. 15,000/-
3. Funeral expenses	-	Rs. 15,000/-
4. Transportation expenses	-	Rs. 10,000/-

Total compensation - **Rs. 1,20,000/-**

In fine, the petitioners are entitled to a sum of **Rs.1,20,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Twenty Thousand Only)** as just and fair compensation and the point is answered accordingly.

12. Pursuant to the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras in CMA.No.428/2016 dated 11.03.2016 reported in 2016 (1) TNMAC 433 (DB) the petitioners have to produce the attested copy of the 1st page of their bank passbook, pan card and the xerox of Aadhar card.

13. In the result,

a) The petition is allowed in part with proportionate cost against the Respondents 1 to 3. Awarding the total compensation of **Rs.1,20,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Twenty Thousand Only)** including interim award passed if any, payable with interest at 7.5% per annum from the date of presentation of the petition.

b) The apportionment of the compensation amount of **Rs.1,20,000/-** is as follows. The petitioners are entitled for equal disbursement of the compensation with proportionate interest and cost.

c) The 3rd respondent is directed to deposit the said compensation amount directly to the bank account of the petitioners as directed by the

Honourable Apex Court in **Parminder Singh /Vs/ Honey Goyal and others** dated 18.03.2025 within one month from the date of award. The petitioners and 3rd respondent are directed to file compliance memo in this regard.

d) The petition is dismissed with regard to the rest of the claim amount.

e) The advocate fee is fixed at **Rs.5,400/-** Court fee for the award amount is **Rs.573/-**. Already sufficient court fee paid.

f) No interest is awarded for the period when the petitioners defaulted, as per orders if any and also for the period when the petitioners failed to pay the Court fees as directed.

g) A free copy of the award shall also be delivered to the parties on request within 15 days as per section 168(2) of the MV Act and Rule 20(6) of the Rules.

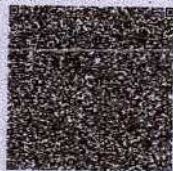

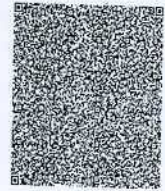
