This petition is filed by Advocate Thiru P. Michael, u/s 482 of BNSS
praying to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

ORDER

Heard both side. Perused the petition.

2. The petitioners/accused are alleged to have committed the offence u/s
296(b), 115(2), 118(1) and 351(3) of BNS.

3. The case of the prosecution is that on 27.02.2026 at about 8.00 P.M., the accused persons abused the defacto complainant in filthy words and assaulted him using weapon and also threatened him. Hence the charge.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the real fact is that the defacto complainant and others harassed the 1st petitioner's wife and caused injury to her and while questioning it, they caused injury to the 1st petitioner with broken brandy bottle and iron rod and the petitioners are innocent of the offences alleged against them in the FIR and they are in no way connected with the alleged occurrence and the injured were discharged from the hospital and it is a case in counter and the petitioners are ready to abide by any condition and prayed for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor opposed the application and submitted that there is a previous enmity between the parties. On 27.02.2026, the defacto complainant and three of his friends went to the temple to attend the procession of devotees, which was questioned by the petitioners. So, A1 pushed down one Anto Robin and kicked on his leg and ear with leg, A2 assaulted him with stick on his right ankle, A4 assaulted on the head of one Shijin with stick, then A1 caused bleeding injury on Shijin and Anto Robin, A3 assaulted the defacto complainant with stick and then A1 assaulted one Sivakumar with stick. Totally there are 4 injured persons in this case and the injured were discharged from the hospital and the investigation is not yet over and it is a case in counter. Entire occurrence took place in the temple and several devotees were present and there were two groups and tension prevails in

that locality and either the petition may be dismissed or the petitioners may be directed to comply the condition in some other district.

6. Considered the objection of the learned Public Prosecutor. Considering the nature of the offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioners/accused and also considering the fact that the injured were discharged from the hospital and it is a case in counter, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners/Accused with conditions.

7. In the result, in the event of arrest or on their appearing before the court concerned the petitioners are ordered to be enlarged on bail on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties each for a likesum to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate No.I, Kuzhithurai subject to the following conditions:-

- i. The petitioners shall appear before the court concerned within 15 days from today without fail.
- ii. After release, the petitioners shall appear and sign before the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Thoothukudy daily twice at 10.30 A.M. and 5.00 P.M. until further orders.
- iii. The petitioners shall also make themselves available before the respondent as and when required.
- iv. The petitioners shall not tamper with the witnesses or in any manner interfere with or put obstacle to the smooth progress of investigation.
- v. The petitioners shall not leave the jurisdictional police limit without prior

permission.

If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation Officer is with in his discretion to approach the court of the learned Judicial Magistrate for cancellation of bail even though bail granted by the Sessions Court as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in *P.K.Shaji /Vs./ State of Kerala, (2005) AIR S.C.W. 5560*.
