The case called out before the Lok Adalath. The plaintiff and defendants are present. The plaintiff and defendants agreed to compromise the matter as per the advise of the well -wishers and Conciliator before the Lok Adalath. There is no coercion, undue influence and misrepresentation by any one before this compromise.

Both parties have filed compromise petition under order 23 rule 3 r/w Sec.151 of CPC with respect to compromise held between them. We have enquired with regard to averments of the compromise petition filed by both parties. They are agreed that they have made compromise with free will and consent. Hence the compromise is satisfied. The compromise petition under order 23 rule 3 r/w Sec.151 of CPC. The terms of the compromise petition read over to both parties in the language known to them.

They admits the content of the petition. The compromise petition is free fair and voluntary. The compromise petition is lawful. Hence, the compromise petition is allowed. The suit is decreed in terms of the compromise petition. Compromise petition is part and parcel of the decree.

Draw final decree after furnishing the non-judicial stamp and after payment of requisite court fee by all the parties.
