This case came on 12.03.2026 before me for final hearing in the presence of Thiru.M.Mohammad Ismail, B.A., L.L.LB., Learned Advocate for the Petitioners/4th Accused and The Assistant Public Prosecutor, Grade-2 for the Respondent/Complainant and upon hearing the arguments and on perusing of records, this court today, delivers the following,

ORDER

The petitioner/4th Accused has filed this petition seeking permission to go abroad to establish his business, despite the pendency of the case.

1. The petitioner in his affidavit would contend that the respondent police has registered this case against him and other for the alleged commission of offence U/s.6(4) of Tamil Nadu Scheduled Commodities (RDCS) Order, 1982 and Section 7 (1) (a) (ii) of Essential Commodities Act, 1955 and the same was pending in C.C.No.854/2023 and he is the holder of Passport No.W5531080 and he is running a poultry business in the name and style as Muthu Poultry Agencies and he wants to establish his business in abroad and thus he approached the Regional Passport Office at Coimbatore and sought Visa clearance and the same was refused in view of the pendency of the above criminal case and due to which he is forced to be detained in the home itself and he is unable to run a business in abroad and he is the sole bread winner of his family and they are depending upon his income and thus seeking permission to pass an order permitting him to go for abroad for his business establishment. Hence, this petition.

2. The respondent/complainant in their counter statement would contend that the prosecution has commenced the trail by examining witnesses and will be completed shortly and if this petition is allowed at this stage, there is chance for absconding and thus this petition may be dismissed.

3. Heard both side. During the pendency of this petition, the trial in the main case in C.C.No.854/2023 has been completed and the Judgment was pronounced today by which the above petitioner/4th accused was acquitted from the accusation as the prosecution has not proved the case beyond all reasonable doubt. Hence, as of now the case against the petitioner/4th accused has been disposed off and thus there is no legal bar to the petitioner/4th accused to travel abroad for his career and business establishment. Considering the same this court inclined to allow this petition as prayed for.

4. In the result, this petition is allowed by permitting the petitioner/4th accused to go abroad for his business establishment.
