These e-petitions coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.R.Vignesh, Advocate for the petitioners in CrI.M.P.No.980/2026, Thiru.S.Monisha, Advocate for the petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.981/2026, and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

**Common Order**

1. Anticipatory Bail applications u/s 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS).
2. Heard both sides.
3. The learned counsel for the petitioners/accused in CrI.M.P.Nos.980 & 981/2026 would submit that the respondent police registered a case against the petitioners and others in Cr.No.68/2026 for the offences u/s 191(2), 191(3), 296(b), 127(2), 115(2), 118(1) and 351(3) of BNS. The petitioners are innocent and they have not committed any offences as alleged. In fact, the petitioners are friends of A1 and on that ground, they are falsely implicated in this case. The petitioners were not at all present at the place of occurrence. A3 is a college student. Injured discharged from hospital. The petitioners have not filed similar petition before the Hon'ble Madurai Bench of Madras High Court or any other court. The petitioners

apprehend arrest at the hands of police and they are ready to abide by any conditions that would be imposed by this court and prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that totally there are 7 accused in this case and the petitioners are A1, A2, A4 and A3 respectively. As per the case of the prosecution, there existed enmity between the defacto-complainant and the accused. As a result, on 22.02.2026 at 11.00 p.m., when the defacto-complainant and his friends were standing near Muthuramalingapuram main road, Pykara, A1 to A7 have come there, abused the defacto-complainant in vulgar words and assaulted him by their hands and with knife and caused injuries to him. On gathering of neighbours, A1 to A7 have criminally intimidated them with dire consequences and fled the scene of occurrence. Hence, the complaint. Injured discharged from hospital on 28.02.2026. Investigation is pending and objected to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offences against the petitioners /accused are u/s 191(2), 191(3), 296(b), 127(2), 115(2), 118(1) and 351(3) of BNS. The occurrence is said to have taken place on 22.02.2026. Injured discharged from hospital on 28.02.2026. On perusal of FIR, it appears that A5 armed with knife brutally assaulted the defacto-complainant at his chest and others have beaten him by their hands. It seems that serious allegations are levelled against A5. The petitioners herein are A1 to A4. No previous case is reported against the petitioners. The petitioner/A3 is stated to be a college student and produced copy of his college identity card for perusal. Considering the above facts, the limited overt act attributed against the petitioners, the discharge of injured and the facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners on conditions.

In the result, in the event of arrest or on their surrendering before the Court concerned the petitioners in CrI.M.P.Nos.980 & 981/2026 are ordered to be released on anticipatory bail on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/-

each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate No.IV, Madurai subject to the following conditions:-

(i) The petitioners shall surrender before the Court concerned within 15 days from today without fail.

(ii) The petitioners in CrI.M.P.Nos.980/2026 shall appear and sign before the Inspector of police, respondent police station **daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of 15 days**. The petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.981/2026 shall appear and sign before the Inspector of police, respondent police station **daily at 05.00 p.m. for a period of 15 days**.

(iii) The petitioners shall co-operate with the investigation and they shall not threaten the witnesses. They shall not induce witnesses and they shall not cause hindrance to the pending investigation.

(iv) If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation officer is within his discretion to approach the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned for cancellation of bail as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in **Shaji/Vs./ State of Kerala, (2005) AIR S.C.W. 5560**.
