This petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.P.Suresh, Advocate for the petitioner and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

Order

1. Bail application u/s 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS).

2. Heard both sides.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner/accused would submit that the respondent police has registered a case against the petitioner and another in Crime No.114/2026 for the offences u/s 309(4), 311 and 351(3) of BNS. The respondent police arrested the petitioner and remanded to judicial custody on 27.02.2026 and is in custody for the past 11 days. The petitioner is innocent and he has not committed any offences as alleged. The petitioner has not filed similar petition before the Hon'ble Madurai Bench of Madras High Court or any other court. The petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions that would be imposed by this Court and prayed to allow the petition.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that totally there are 2 accused in this case and the petitioner is A2. As per the case of the prosecution, on 24.02.2026 at 07.15 a.m., when the defacto-complainant was standing near Narayanapuram Kanmai, A1 and A2 have threatened the defacto-complainant and committed

robbery of Rs.900/- from at knife point and also criminally intimidated him and the public with dire consequences and fled the scene of occurrence. Hence, the complaint. The petitioner has one previous case in Crime No.311/2025 under Arms Act. Investigation is pending and objected to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offences against the petitioner/accused are u/s 309(4), 311 and 351(3) of BNS. The occurrence is said to have taken place on 27.02.2026. The petitioner is in custody only for 11 days. Investigation is at early stage. The petitioner is recently involved in Crime No.311/2025 under Arms Act. Considering the above facts, the nature of offences, the early stage of investigation, the short period of custody of petitioner, the petitioner's recent involvement in criminal activities and the strong objections placed on the side of prosecution, this court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner at this stage and accordingly, the petition is liable to be dismissed.

In the result, the petition is dismissed.
