This petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.S.Ranichandra, Advocate for the petitioner and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

**Order**

1. Petition to relax the Condition.
2. The offences alleged are u/s 75, 296(b), 115(2), 133 & 351(3) of BNS and 4 of TNPWH Act.
3. Heard both sides.
4. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner was granted bail by this Court as per order in CrI.M.P.No.430/2026 dated 11.02.2026 on conditions to appear and sign before the Inspector of police, respondent police station daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of 30 days. The petitioner is complying with the said condition for the past 18 days. The native of petitioner is Ramanathapuram District and she has to travel daily to Madurai to observe the condition and the petitioner finds it difficult to comply with the condition. Investigation is almost completed. Hence it is prayed to relax the condition. The learned Public Prosecutor has not denied the number of days of compliance of condition by the petitioner. He further stated that charge sheet is not yet filed and placed objections to allow the petition.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. While granting bail to the petitioner, considering the nature of offences and the stage of investigation, this court has specifically directed the petitioner to comply with the condition for 30 days. The petitioner has complied with the condition only for 18 days and filed the present petition without any concrete reasons. Charge sheet is not yet filed. There is no reasonable grounds to relax the condition. Considering the above said facts, the nature of offences and the strong objections placed on the side of prosecution, this court is not inclined to relax the condition and accordingly, the petition is liable to be dismissed.

In the result, the petition is dismissed.
