This e-petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.J.Vasanth, Advocate for the petitioners and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

**Order**

1. Anticipatory bail application u/s 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023.

2. Heard both.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners/A2 and A4 would submit that the respondent police has registered a case against the petitioners and others in Cr.No.120/2026 for the offences u/s. 191(2), 296(b), 115(2), 351(2) and 49 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023. The alleged occurrence is said to have taken place on 05.02.2026. The petitioners are innocent and they have not committed any offence as alleged. The defacto-complainant and the petitioners are close relatives. Due to civil dispute, the defacto-complainant has given false complaint against the petitioners. Counter case is also pending. Injured discharged from the hospital. Investigation is almost over. The petitioners have not filed similar petition before the Hon'ble Madurai Bench of Madras High Court or any other court. The petitioners apprehend arrest at the hands of police and they are ready to abide by

any conditions that would be imposed by this court and prayed to allow the petition.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that totally there are 5 accused persons in this case and the petitioners are A2 and A4. As per the case of the prosecution, the defacto-complainant and the accused persons are relatives. Due to property dispute, on 05.02.2026 at 9.00 p.m., all the accused persons abused the defacto-complainant in filthy words, A3 assaulted the him with wooden log, all other accused assaulted him by hands and also criminally intimidated him. Hence, the case. Injured discharged from the hospital. Investigation is pending and objected to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offences against the petitioner are U/s. 329(4), 296(b), 115(2), 351(3), 49 and 324(2) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023. The alleged occurrence is said to have taken place on 26.01.2025. Injured discharged from the hospital. On perusal of F.I.R., the petitioners are said to have assaulted the injured by hands. No bad antecedent is reported against the petitioners. Substantial part of investigation ought to have been completed by this time. Considering all these aspects, the nature of offences, the overt act against the petitioners and the facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners on conditions.

In the result in the event of arrest or on their surrendering before the Court concerned the petitioners are ordered to be released on anticipatory bail on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties each for a likesum to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate No.II, Madurai subject to the following conditions:-

(i) The petitioners shall surrender before the Court concerned within 15 days from today without fail.

(ii) The petitioners shall appear and sign before the Inspector of police, respondent police station **daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of 15 days.**

(iii) The petitioners shall co-operate with the investigation and they shall not threaten the witnesses. They shall not induce witnesses and they shall not cause hindrance to the pending investigation.

If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation officer is within his discretion to approach the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned for cancellation of bail as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in **Shaji/Vs./ State of Kerala, (2005) AIR S.C.W. 5560.**
