This petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.S.Thangaraj, Advocate for the petitioner and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

**Order**

1. Bail application u/s 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS).

2. Heard both sides.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner/accused would submit that the respondent police has registered a case in Crime No.55/2026 for the offence u/s 25(1A) of Arms Act against the petitioner. The respondent police arrested the petitioner and remanded to judicial custody on 25.02.2026 and is in custody for the past 16 days. The petitioner is a college student, he is innocent and he has not committed any offences as alleged. The petitioner has not filed similar petition before the Hon'ble Madurai Bench of Madras High Court or any other court. The petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions that would be imposed by this Court and prayed to allow the petition.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that it is a case of single accused, who is the petitioner herein. As per the case of the prosecution, on 25.02.2026 at 10.30 a.m., near Gandhipuram Kanmai, K.Pudur, Madurai, the defacto-

complainant, who is the Sub Inspector of Police, K.Pudur P.S. arrested the petitioner for having possession of a long size knife with intention to commit crimes. The defacto-complainant recovered a knife from the petitioner. Hence, the complaint. The petitioner is involved in one previous case in Crime No.356/2025 u/s 191(1), 191(2), 126(2), 118(1), 137(2), 351(3) and 3(5) of BNS. Investigation is pending and objected to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offence against the petitioner/accused is u/s 25(1A) of Arms Act. The occurrence is said to have taken place on 25.02.2026. Case property was recovered. The measurement of the weapon said to have been recovered from the petitioner is not mentioned in the FIR. The petitioner is in custody for 16 days. Material part of investigation ought to have been completed by this time. It is submitted on the side of petitioner that the petitioner is studying in American College, Madurai and that he is falsely implicated in this case. Though the petitioner has one previous case, it seems that no previous case of similar offence is pending against him. Considering all these aspects, the period of incarceration of petitioner and the facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner on conditions.

In the result, the petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail on his executing a bond for Rs.10,000/- along with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Madurai subject to the following conditions:-

(i) After release, the petitioner shall appear and sign before the Inspector of police, respondent police station **daily at 05.00 p.m. for a period of 15 days.**

(ii) The petitioner shall co-operate with the investigation and shall not threaten the witnesses and shall not cause hindrance to the pending investigation.

(iii) That the petitioner shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or of the commission of which he is suspected and

(iv) If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation Officer is within his discretion to approach the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate, concerned for cancellation of bail as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in **P.K.Shaji/Vs/State of Kerala, (2005) AIR S.C.W.5560.**
