This e-petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.M.Karuppasamy, Advocate for the petitioner and of Public Prosecutor for the state, this court passed the following:

Order

1. Anticipatory Bail application u/s 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS).

2. Heard both sides.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner/accused would submit that the respondent police has registered a case against the petitioner and others in Cr.No.24/2026 for the offences u/s 296(b), 115(2), 118(1) & 351(3) of BNS. The petitioner is innocent and he has not committed any offence as alleged. Injured discharged from hospital. The petitioner has not filed similar petition before the Hon'ble Madurai Bench of Madras High Court or any other court. The petitioner apprehends arrest at the hands of police and he is ready to abide by any conditions that would be imposed by this court and prayed to allow the petition.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that totally there are 4 accused in this case and the petitioner is A1. As per the case of the prosecution, the defacto-

complainant is the mother of injured, who is a mentally retarded person. On 19.02.2026 at 06.30 p.m., when the defacto-complainant's son was sitting near Kalamman temple of their village, A1 to A4 have abused him in vulgar words and assaulted him with brick-stone and also criminally intimidated him with dire consequences and left. Hence, the case. Injured discharged from hospital on 26.02.2026. The petitioner has one previous case in Crime No.153/2026. Investigation is pending and made objections to allow the petition.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offences against the petitioner /accused are u/s 296(b), 115(2), 118(1) & 351(3) of BNS. The occurrence is said to have taken place on 19.02.2026. Injured discharged from hospital on 26.02.2026. Material part of investigation ought to have been completed by this time. Considering all these aspects, the discharge of injured, the nature of offences and punishment for the same and the facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner on conditions.

In the result, in the event of arrest or on his surrendering before the Court concerned the petitioner is ordered to be released on anticipatory bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate, Peraiyur subject to the following conditions:-

(i) The petitioner shall surrender before the Court concerned within 15 days from today without fail.

(ii) The petitioner shall appear and sign before the Inspector of police, respondent police station **daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of 30 days.**

(iii) The petitioner shall co-operate with the investigation and shall not threaten the witnesses. He shall not induce witnesses and shall not cause hindrance to the pending investigation.

(iv) If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation officer is within his discretion to approach the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned for cancellation of bail as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in **Shaji/Vs./ State of Kerala, (2005) AIR S.C.W. 5560.**
