This e-petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.P.Chandran, Advocate for the petitioner and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

Order

1. Anticipatory Bail application u/s 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS).

2. Heard both.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner/A1 would submit that the respondent police has registered a case against the petitioner and others in Cr.No.299/2026 for the offences u/s. 296(b), 118(1) and 351(3) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023. The petitioner is innocent and she has not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution. Due to previous enmity, the defacto-complainant has given false complaint against the petitioner. Injured discharged from the hospital. Investigation is almost over. No similar petition is filed or pending before any superior courts. The petitioner apprehends arrest at the hands of police. The petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions that would be imposed by this Court and prayed to allow the petition.

4. Per contra, the learned Public Prosecutor submitted that totally there are 2 named accused and others involved in this case and the petitioner is A1. As per the case of the prosecution, due to previous enmity, on 29.05.2026, there was wordy quarrel between the defacto-complainant and A1 near Sakthi Mariamman Temple. A2 is the mother of A1. Both accused abused the defacto-complainant in filthy words, A1 assaulted her with iron rod on head and both accused caused criminal intimidation. Injuries are simple in nature. Injured discharged from the hospital. Investigation is pending and objected to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offences against the petitioner are U/s. 296(b), 118(1) and 351(3) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023. As per prosecution, injured sustained only simple injuries. Injured discharged from the hospital. No bad antecedent is reported against the petitioner. Material part of investigation ought to have been completed by this time. Considering all these aspects, the nature offences and the punishment for the same, the discharge of injured and the facts and circumstances of this case, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner on conditions.

In the result, in the event of arrest or on her surrendering before the Court concerned the petitioner is ordered to be released on anticipatory bail on her executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate No.II, Madurai subject to the following conditions:-

(i) The petitioner shall surrender before the concerned Court within 15 days from today; failing which, the petition shall stand automatically canceled.

(ii) The petitioner shall appear and sign before the Inspector of police, respondent police station **daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of 30 days.**

(iii) The petitioner shall co-operate with the investigation, shall not threaten the witnesses, shall not induce the witnesses and shall not cause hindrance to the pending investigation.

(iv) The petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence.

(v) If there is any violation of condition, the Investigation officer is within his discretion to approach the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned for cancellation of bail as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court reported in **Shaji/Vs./ State of Kerala, (2005) AIR S.C.W. 5560.**
