This petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.B.Aravinthan, Advocate for the petitioner and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

Order

1. Bail application u/s 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS).

2. Heard both sides.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner/accused submitted that the respondent police has registered a case in Cr.No.245/2026 for the offences u/s 331(3), 331(4) and 305(a) of BNS against the petitioner and another. The petitioner is in judicial custody for the past 23 days. All the main allegations are levelled against A1 only. Since the petitioner and A1 have extra marital affair, the respondent police falsely roped her into this case. The petitioner is in no way connected with the alleged offences committed by A1. The petitioner was not present at the alleged place of occurrence. The gold ornaments said to have been recovered from the petitioner exclusively belong to her and not the stolen one. There is nobody to take care of her two minor children, except the petitioner. No similar petition is filed or pending before any superior courts. The petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions that would be imposed by this Court and that the petition is to be allowed.

4. Per contra, the learned Public Prosecutor submitted that on 25.05.2026, A1 has committed house breaking and stolen gold ornaments, American Dollar, London Pound, Apple Phones, Laptop, Indian Rupees, foreign watch, etc. worth Rs.52,85,000/- from the defacto-complainant's house and handed over the gold ornaments to the petitioner/A2, who has sold the same and purchased new ornaments. 11 sovereigns and cash Rs.86,500/- alone recovered. Investigation is pending and objected to allow the petition.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offences against the petitioner/A2 are u/s 331(3), 331(4) and 305(a) of BNS. It is a case of house breaking and theft of gold ornaments, other valuable articles, cash, etc. worth about Rs.52,85,000/-. As per prosecution, so far only 11 sovereigns and cash Rs.86,500/- alone are recovered. The petitioner is in custody only for 23 days. Investigation is at early stage. Considering the above facts, the serious nature of offences, the non-recovery of entire stolen articles and the strong objections placed on the side of prosecution coupled with early stage of investigation, I am not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner at this stage and accordingly, the petition is liable to be dismissed.

In the result, the petition is dismissed.
