This e-petition coming on today for hearing before me in the presence of Ms.M.Ramar, Advocate for the petitioners and of Public Prosecutor for the State, this court passed the following:

Order

1. Anticipatory bail applications u/s 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023.

2. Heard both.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners/A1 to A6 submitted that the respondent police has registered a case against the petitioners in Cr.No.168/2026 for the offences u/s. 126(2), 296(b), 115(2), 127(a) and 49 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023. The petitioners are innocent and they have not committed any offence as alleged. No similar petition is filed or pending before any superior courts. The petitioners apprehend arrest at the hands of police and they are ready to abide by any conditions that would be imposed by this court and prayed to allow the petition.

4. Per contra, the learned Public Prosecutor submitted that all the offences are bailable in nature and the petition is not maintainable. Hence, prayed to dismiss

the petition.

5. Rival contentions are taken into consideration. The alleged offences against the petitioners are U/s. 126(2), 296(b), 115(2), 127(a) and 49 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023. On perusal of F.I.R., it appears that all the offences are bailable in nature. Therefore, question of apprehension does not arise. The petition is not maintainable and accordingly liable to be dismissed.

In the result, the petition is dismissed with direction to the petitioners to surrender before the concerned court within 15 days, upon such surrender, the learned Judicial Magistrate is directed to proceed in accordance with law.
