This petition came up before me for final hearing on this day in the presence of Thiru.J.Karuppasamy, Advocate for the petitioners/accused and the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor for the respondent and upon hearing the arguments of both sides, this court delivers the following:-

ORDER

1. This petition has been filed under section 480 of BNSS to enlarge the petitioner/accused on bail for the alleged commission of offence under section 331(3), 305(a) BNS to enlarge the petitioner/accused on bail.
2. Notice issued to respondent, reply received and heard both side argument.
3. The Learned counsel for the petitioner/accused submitted that the petitioner/ accused has not committed any offence. The police registered a false case against the petitioners/accused. The petitioner/accused is ready and willing to abide by the condition, if any imposed by this court. The

petitioner/accused is remanded to Judicial custody on 14/01/2026 and he is in custody for the past 55 days. He prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

4. Considering the fact and circumstances of this case the period of incarceration being under gone by the accused and taking note of the submission made by the counsel of the petitioner/accused. Custodial interrogation is no more necessary in this case. This court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner/accused on conditions that the petitioner/accused should appear and sign before this respondent police station daily at 10.00 A.M until further orders.
5. In the result, the petitioner/accused is enlarged on bail that he has to execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- along with two sureties for a like sum each.
6. The petitioner/accused shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.
7. The petitioner/accused shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.
