This case was taken on file 19.09.2025 in this court and coming on for final hearing on this the 02.03.2026 in the presence of Mr. R. Karthikeyan, Advocate, appearing for the Petitioner and on perusal of available material records and upon hearing the petitioner side and having stood over for consideration till this day, this court delivers the following:

ORDER

This petition has been filed U/s 144 of BNSS 2023 seeking maintenance against the Respondent.

1. The brief averments made in the petition are as follows;

The Petitioner in the petition stated that the Petitioner and the Respondent were married on 16.07.2023 at the Aringar Anna Thirumana Mandabam. During the marriage, the petitioner was given a 25 Powns for the Petitioner, 5 Pown for the Respondent, furniture worth Rs.50,000/-. The Respondent worked in Lorry Driver. The respondent is a driver and earns Rs.1,500/- to Rs.3,000 per day. The respondent had been harassing the petitioner so that he would have sexual intercourse with her

after drinking alcohol. "வேலைக்கு சென்று திரும்பி வரும் பொழுது சில பெண்களை வீட்டுக்கு அழைத்துக் கொண்டு வந்து வீட்டிலேயே அவர்களோடு ஒரு வாரம் உடலுறவு வைத்துக் கொண்டு பின் வேலைக்கு செல்லும் பொழுது திரும்ப கொண்டு போய் விட்டு விடும் பழக்கம் உடையவர்." Therefore, the petitioner filed a complaint against the Respondent at the Kuthalam Police Station on 14.06.2025. The respondent told the Petitioner, "என்னைப் பற்றி புகார் கொடுத்துவிட்டு என் வீட்டிலேயே நீ இருக்க முடியுமா" and beat the petitioner and chased him away. The respondent is obligated to provide maintenance to the petitioner. The respondent is a driver and earns Rs.2,000/- to Rs.5,000 per day. The Petition has been filed claiming maintenance from the Respondent for a sum of Rs.12,000/- for Petitioner and litigation expenses for a sum of Rs.30,000/-.

2. On the side of the Petitioners PW1 Rabiya Beevi examined and Ex.P.1 was Marked. Respondent called absent and set exparte.

3. The point for determination in this case is whether the Petitioner is entitled to receive the maintenance as claimed in the petition from the Respondent or not ?

4. The Petition has been filed claiming maintenance from the Respondent for a sum of Rs.12,000/- for Petitioner and Litigation expenses a sum of Rs.30,000/- for Petitioner. Respondent called absent and set exparte. On the side of the Petitioners, PW1 Rabiya Beevi examined and Ex.P.1 was marked. To prove the marriage between the Petitioner and Respondent, Ex.P.1 Marriage Invitation filed. To prove the income of the Respondent, no documents filed before this court.

5. The Petitioners in the petition stated that she was unable to maintain herself and further stated that Respondent earning Rs.2,000/- to Rs.5,000/- per day in the Driver. The Respondent not appeared before this court and not denied the averments

and allegations in the petition. Hence considering the living condition of the Petitioner and found that the Respondent failed to maintain the Petitioner and hence this court is inclined to order maintenance for the Petitioners for a sum of Rs.10,000/- Per month.

6. In the result, this petition is partly allowed and the Respondent is directed to pay a sum of Rs.10,000/- per month to the Petitioner within 5th of every English calender month and also directed to pay the maintenance from the date of filing of the petition. No Costs.
