ORDER

1. This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused seeking closure of FIR on the ground that the limitation prescribed u/s.468 of Cr.P.C is expired.

2. Enquiry heard. The respondent police had registered a case against the petitioner in the Cr.No 615/2021 for the alleged commission of offences U/s.147,294(b) and 323 IPC. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of ***Ghansham Soni Vs State (Govt of NCT, Delhi) 2025 INSC 803*** has categorically held that for the computation of the limitation period of U/s.468 Cr.P.C, the relevant date is the date of filing of the complainant or the date of institution of prosecution and not the date on which the Magistrate takes cognizance.

3. Therefore, applying the said dictum to the case on hand, it is observed that the prosecution has been instituted well within the period of limitation. Hence, this petition lacks merit and so it is dismissed.
