This Petition coming on 05.03.2026 before me for final hearing in the presence of Thiru. P.Elamaiselvan, learned Counsel for the Petitioner and the learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and having arguments of both parties, perusing the Records and having stood over for consideration till this day, this Court delivers the following..

ORDER

1.This Petition has been filed U/s.480 of BNSS Act, 2023 for granting of Bail to the Petitioner who has been remanded for the alleged offences U/s.115(2), 296(b), 351(2) , 74 of BNS Act.

2. The learned counsel for the Petitioner/Accused would submit that the Petitioner was remanded to judicial custody on 27.02.2026. The Petitione is innocent Person, he is not committed any such offence and he is falsely implicated in this case. No previous case on the Petitioner/Accused. The Petitioner Submit that, if the Petitioner released on bail the Petitioners will not evade trial and will not tamper any witness and he is ready to obey any condition which will impose by this Hon'ble

court. He is ready to offer sufficient sureties before this Hon'ble Court. No similar Petition is pending before the Hon'ble Court, and no Petition was dismissed by the Hon'ble High Court. Hence, prays to enlarge him on bail.

3. Both the Investigation officer and learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit in reply stating that in this case Investigation is yet to be completed. If accused released on bail there are many chances to do the same act. If the accused released on bail he will abscond and tamper the witnesses and it is difficult for the police to secure him again. Hence prosecution strongly object to the accused released on bail.

4. This Court had carefully considered the rival submissions of both side parties. It is noticed from Records and oral representation of the prosecution, that the Petitioner has been in judicial custody for past 07 days. Considering the nature of the offences, contentions of the Petitioner and the fact that in this case, victim discharged from hospital. Hence, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the Petitioner with following conditions:-

1. The Petitioner/Accused shall execute a bond for Rs.10,000/- with two sureties each for like sum.
2. The Petitioner/Accused should appear and sign before V.Kalathur police station daily at 08.30 A.M. for 15 days.
3. The Petitioner/Accused shall not tampering the witnesses and shall cooperate with the investigation officer whenever he requires.
4. The Petitioner/Accused shall not breach any of the conditions in the bail bond.
