This petition coming before me on 07.03.2026 for final hearing in the presence of Thiru. A. Hariraman, Advocate appearing for petitioner and Respondent Police representing for state, Upon hearing arguments of both parties, perusing the records and having stood over for consideration till this day, this Court delivers the following,

ORDER

1) The petitioner has filed this application under section 480 of BNSS Act 2023 seeking bail for the offence U/s. 303(2), 317(2) of BNS.

2) The petitioner counsel would submit that petitioner was remanded to Judicial custody by this Court on 11.02.2026 with the false allegation and that the petitioner has been Judicial custody for past 25 days and the petitioner is an innocent and that bail may be granted to the petitioner. The Police would submit through his reply, that the said case investigation is still pending. If he released on bail, there is possibility to abscond and commit the same kind of offences and tampering the witnesses and he has previous cases in various Station. Hence police strongly objects to the accused released on bail.

3) This court has carefully considered the rival submissions of both parties. It is noticed from the records and oral representation of the Petitioner side, he has been in judicial custody for past 25 days. Most of the investigation is completed in this case. Therefore the objection raised by the Respondent Police side is not sustained and no necessity to kept the accused further Judicial custody for the above reason. Hence considering the nature and factual position of the case this court is inclined to grant bail to the Petitioner with following conditions:-

1. The Petitioner/Accused shall execute a bond for Rs.10,000/- with two sureties for like sum.

2. The Petitioner/Accused shall appear and sign before respondent police station for 15 days at 10.00 a.m after he released from the prison.

3. The Petitioner/Accused shall not tampering the witnesses and shall cooperate with the investigation officer whenever he requires.

4. The Petitioner/Accused shall not breach any of the conditions in the bail bond.
