Petition dated: 27.02.2026 U/s.483 BNSS to grant bail.

This petition coming on this day for hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.K.Arivarasan, B.Sc., B.L., the learned Counsel for the petitioner and of Thiru.B.Karthikeyan, B.A., B.L, the learned Public Prosecutor Public Prosecutor for the State and upon hearing both sides submissions, this Court passes the following:

ORDER

The petitioner/sole accused who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 19.02.2026 in Cr.No.40/2026 on the file of the respondent police for the offence punishable U/s.305(a) BNS, seeks bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner and one another are carpenters. On 09.02.2026 at about 9.30 a.m., they were attending carpentry work at



the defacto complainant's house. At that time, the petitioner allegedly stole 2 sovereigns of gold jewels from the house. The same was noticed by the defacto complainant on 14.02.2026, and based on the complaint, a case was registered against the petitioner.

3. The learned Counsel for the petitioner contended that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and that he was arrested on 19.02.2026 and he is in judicial custody for the past 17 days. He further submitted that the property has been recovered and that there is no previous case against this petitioner and that most of the investigation has been completed. He further submitted that the earlier application was dismissed by the learned Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi in CIS CrI.M.P.No.121/2026 dated 24.02.2026 and that if the petitioner is released on bail, he is ready to obey the conditions imposed if any by this court and he would not abscond and also not tamper or threaten the witnesses and he prays to release the petitioner on bail.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor contended that the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 19.02.2026 and that the stolen properties namely jewels were recovered and that no previous case pending against the petitioner.



5. Considering the nature of offence, the period of incarceration, and that the stolen properties have been secured and considering that substantial part of the investigation is over and also that there is no criminal antecedents, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with the following conditions;

i) that the petitioner/A4 is ordered to be enlarged on bail on execution of a bond for a sum **Rs.10,000/-(Rupees Ten Thousand only)** each with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi;**

ii) that the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or Bank pass book to ensure their identity;

iii) that **the petitioner shall report before the Inspector of Police, respondent police station daily twice at 10.30 a.m and 5.00 p.m for a period of one month** and on further condition that he shall make available himself for interrogation as and when required by the investigation Officer;

iv) that the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witnesses either during investigation or trial;

v) that the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

vi) that on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in

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accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the **Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji-vs- State of Kerala(2005) AIR SCW 5560;**

vii) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered U/s.269 BNS, 2023.
