Petition dated 05.03.2026 U/s.482 BNSS to grant anticipatory bail.

This petition coming on this day for hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.M.Raja Sahul Hameed, B.Sc., B.L., the learned Counsel for the petitioners and of Thiru.B.Karthikeyan, B.A., B.L., the learned Public Prosecutor for the State and upon hearing both sides submissions, this Court passes the following:

ORDER

The petitioners/A1 to A3 who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police in Cr.No.111/2026 for the offences punishable U/s.296(b), 115(2), 118(1), 351(3) BNS, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to some misunderstanding between



both parties, on 27.02.2026 at about 3.00 p.m when the defacto complainant and his friend were at a school ground the petitioners came there and abused them in filthy language and assaulted them with iron rod and hands on their head and body and caused injuries and also threatened them with dire consequences and on complaint the case was registered.

3. The learned Counsel for the petitioners contended that the petitioners have not committed any such offence and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He further submitted that the injured was discharged from hospital and that most of the investigation is complete and that there is no previous case pending against the petitioners and that if the petitioners are released on anticipatory bail, they are ready to obey the conditions imposed if any by this court and they would not abscond and tamper the witnesses and he prays to release the petitioners on anticipatory bail.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor contended that the injured was discharged from hospital on 06.03.2026 and that five witnesses have been examined and that there are no previous cases pending against the petitioners.

5. Considering the nature of the offence, the facts and circumstances of the case, and the fact that the injured has been discharged from the hospital, that a substantial part of the investigation is over and also that there are no criminal antecedents against the petitioners, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with the following conditions;



6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned **Judicial Magistrate No.II, Ramanathapuram**; on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties** each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned and if the petitioners/accused did not surrender within 15 days from the date of this order, this anticipatory bail stands cancelled automatically and on further conditions that:

ii) that the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or Bank pass book to ensure their identity;

iii) Considering the nature of injuries and duration of treatment, the petitioners shall report before the **learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Ramanathapuram daily once at 10.30 a.m for a period of one month** and on further condition that they shall make available themselves for interrogation as and when required by the investigation Officer;

iv) that the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witnesses either during investigation or trial;

vi) that the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

vii) that on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in



accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the

Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji-vs- State of Kerala(2005) AIR SCW 5560;

viii) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered U/s.269 BNS, 2023.
