Petition dated 06.03.2025 U/s.482 BNSS to grant anticipatory bail.

This petition coming on this day for hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.S.Chellamani, B.A., B.L., the learned Counsel for the petitioner and Thiru.B.Karthikeyan, B.A., B.L., the learned Public Prosecutor for the State and upon hearing both sides submissions, this Court passes the following:

ORDER

The petitioner/A1 who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable U/s.296(b), 324(2), 351(2) of BNS, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. According to the prosecution, both parties are neighbours and there was an altercation between them regarding the flowing of waste water. On 02.09.2025 at about 3.00 p.m., the petitioner abused the defacto complainant in



filthy language, damaged the tiles of the house, and also threatened him with dire consequences. Based on the complaint, the case was registered

3. The learned Counsel for the petitioner contended that the petitioner has not committed any such offence and he is in no way connected with the offence. He further contended that most of the investigation is complete and that if the petitioner is released on anticipatory bail, he is ready to obey the conditions imposed if any by this court and he would not abscond. Hence he prays to release the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor contended that the material part of the investigation is complete and that two previous cases are pending against the petitioner for the offences u/s.506(ii) IPC, 131, 351(3) BNS including TNPPDL Act and his name is in History Sheet and that if the petitioner is released on anticipatory bail, there is a possibility that he would indulge in similar offence again.

5. There are previous cases pending against the petitioner. However, considering the nature of offence and facts and circumstances of the case and the fact that substantial part of the investigation is over, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with the following conditions:

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the



date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi** on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties** each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned and if the petitioners/accused did not surrender within 15 days from the date of this order, this anticipatory bail stand cancelled automatically and on further conditions that:

ii) that the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or Bank pass book to ensure their identity;

iii) Considering the facts of the previous cases, the **petitioner shall report before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruvadanai daily twice at 10.30 a.m and 5.00 p.m for a period of one month** and on further condition that he shall make available himself for interrogation as and when required by the investigation Officer;

iv) that the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witnesses either during investigation or trial;

v) that the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

vi) that on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and

the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the **Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji-vs- State of Kerala(2005) AIR SCW 5560;**

vii) If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered U/s.269 BNS, 2023.
