Petition dated: 07.03.2026 U/s.483 BNSS to grant bail.

This petition coming on this day for hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.G.Kesavan, Legal Aid Defense Counsel for the petitioner and Thiru.B.Karthikeyan, B.A., B.L., the learned Public Prosecutor for the State and upon hearing both sides submissions, this Court passes the following:

ORDER

The petitioner/A1 who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 18.01.2026 by the respondent police in Cr.No.24/2026 for the offence punishable U/s. 25(1A) Arms Act, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that, based on information the respondent police went to the occurrence place 18.01.2026 at about 13.30 p.m they found that the petitioner and A1 have illegally possessed a sword and knife and were abusing and threatening the public in filthy language. Further both accused were apprehended by



the police along with weapon and in consequence, the case was registered.

3. The learned Counsel for the petitioner contended that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and that he was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 18.01.2026 and he is in judicial custody for the past 52 days and that property were secured and that most of the investigation is complete and that if the petitioner is released on bail, he is ready to obey the conditions imposed if any and he would not abscond and hence, he prays to release the petitioner on bail.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor contended that totally 2 accused are involved in this case and the petitioner is arrayed as A2 and that A1 was released on bail by this Court on 28.01.2026 . He further submitted that the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 18.01.2026 and that the property has been recovered and that the five witnesses have been examined. He further submitted that no previous case pending against the petitioner.

5. The petitioner is in judicial custody for more than 51 days. Considering the nature of offence and long period of incarceration and the fact that substantial part of the investigation is complete and that there is no criminal antecedents and release of co-accused on bail, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with the following stringent conditions;

i) that the petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail on execution of a bond for a sum Rs.10,000/-(Rupees Ten Thousand only) **with two sureties** for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi;**



ii) that the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or Bank pass book to ensure their identity;

iii) that the petitioner shall report before the Inspector of police, respondent police station **daily once at 10.30 a.m for a period of 15 days** and on further condition that he shall make available himself for interrogation as and when required by the investigation Officer;

iv) that the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witnesses either during investigation or trial;

v) that the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

vi) that on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the **Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji-vs- State of Kerala(2005) AIR SCW 5560;**

vii) If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered U/s.269 BNS, 2023.
