This petition was coming on 06.03.2026 for final hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.M.Arunkannan, Advocate for the petitioner, Thiru.V.T.Ramakrishnan, Special Public Prosecutor for the Respondent / Complainant and upon perusing the materials and hearing the arguments on both, this court passed the following...

**ORDER**

The petitioner has filed the petition in U/s.497 and 503 of BNSS

The petitioner is the owner of the two wheeler TN 65 BY 5897 KTM 200 DUKE.

The petitioner in his affidavit has stated that the respondent / complainant police have recovered his motorcycle for the purpose of investigation and produce the same before this court and numbered as P.R.No.1/2026. He has further stated that he is in need of his motorcycle for the day to day activities. Unless, the motorcycle is returned the same would



be ruined due to rain, wind and temperature and without safety and maintenance. Therefore, he prayed to pass an order to return his vehicle.

2. The respondent police have submitted that if the vehicle is handed over the petitioner she may sell or altered the vehicle and therefore they objected to return the vehicle.

3. The petitioner / accused in order to show that he is the owner of the motorcycle has produced the copy of the Registration certificate. As per registration certificate the petitioner is owner. As submitted by the learned counsel for the petitioner if the vehicle (motorcycle) is not returned the same would be ruined or it will lose its utility.

4. Therefore, this court is inclined to hand over the motorcycle to the petitioner's custody with conditions. Accordingly, the vehicle, i.e., KTM 200 DUKE, bearing registration No. TN 65 BY 5897, is ordered to be returned to the petitioner's custody on the following terms.

1. The petitioner shall execute a bond for Rs.50,000/- with one surety for the like sum.
2. The Original R.C Book of the vehicle shall be produced for verification.
3. A Panchanama with the photographs of the vehicle with any special description marks shall be produced before this court in Judicial Form 82 of Criminal Rules of Practice.
4. The petitioner shall file an affidavit that the property will not be alienated, encumbered or altered in any manner pending disposal of the case.

5. The petitioner shall undertake that he will not make any objection to mark the Panchanama and photographs of the motorcycle in question the during time of trial.

In the result, the petition is allowed on the above terms.
