The petition is coming on this day for final hearing before me, in the presence of Thiru.P.Gunasekaran, Advocate for the petitioner and Thiru.G.Prakasam, Public Prosecutor for the State, after hearing both sides and perusing the written reply submitted by the respondent and records, this court delivers the following ...

### **ORDER**

1. The petitioner is apprehending arrest based on CSR.No.260/2026 for the offence punishable under Section(s) 248, 318 and 356 of BNS (subsequently, based on fresh complaint, case has been registered in Cr.No.23/2026 u/sec. 69 and 351(2) of BNS) and had filed this petition u/s.482 of B.N.S.S., seeking for his release on anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest.

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2. According to the petitioner, the defacto complainant lodged a false complaint against the petitioner as if he and the defacto complainant loved each other and now he spread the slander of the defacto complainant and the said complaint was received by the respondent/police in CSR.No.260/2026 and the same is pending. Further according to the petitioner, he is studying 2<sup>nd</sup> year Doctorate at Periyar University and the defacto complainant also studying Doctorate 3<sup>rd</sup> year, she expose to willing to marry the petitioner, which was refused by him since she is an already married person, so she lodged a false complaint against the petitioner. The petitioner has given undertaking that he would never abscond nor tamper or hamper the witnesses and ready to abide by any conditions imposed by the Court and willing to produce sufficient solvent sureties to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate. Hence, the petitioner pray for considering his anticipatory bail application.

3. The respondent filed his detailed objections in writing and the learned Public Prosecutor had submitted that CSR.No.260/2026 has already been closed on 12.06.2026, subsequently, based on a fresh complaint lodged by the defacto complainant on 03.07.2026, the case has been registered in Cr.No.23/2026 u/sec.69 and 351(2) of BNS and the investigation is pending.



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4. This Court has considered the rival submissions and perused the materials available on record.

5. It is reported that the earlier CSR given by the defacto complainant was closed on 12.06.2026, subsequently on an improved complaint, the case has been registered by the respondent police. The incident occurred from 2025 onwards, relating to love affairs between the petitioner and the defacto complainant. Considering the above circumstances and the fact that both are doing Ph.D., in Periyar University, this Court is inclined to consider the anticipatory bail application of the petitioner with the following conditions.

**In the result, this anticipatory bail application is allowed** and the petitioner is directed to surrender before the Judicial Magistrate, Addl. Mahila Court, Salem within 15 days from the date of receipt of the order or in the event of his arrest and production before the Judicial Magistrate concerned, he is ordered to be released on anticipatory bail on his executing bond for Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Addl. Mahila Court, Salem.

(i) The petitioner shall **appear and sign before the Respondent Police Station daily at 10.30 a.m., and 5.30 p.m., for 30 days** and thereafter, shall



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appear on summons. In the event that the petitioner fail to surrender within 15 days from the date of the order, the anticipatory bail granted will automatically lapse.

(ii) The sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impressions and produce valid identity proof such as Aadhaar Card or bank passbook, and the petitioner shall also furnish his photograph and identity documents. The petitioner shall provide his active mobile number and email address, if any, along with an alternative contact number of an adult family member, which shall be treated as **official contact details for service of summons and communications, and the same shall not be altered without prior permission of the Court;** any such change without intimation shall entail presumption of due service and may be treated as indicative of absconding.

(iii) The petitioner shall co operate the investigation as an when required and shall not directly or indirectly induce, threaten, or promise any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the Court or to the police. The petitioner shall not leave the State of Tamil Nadu without prior permission of the learned Judicial Magistrate and shall not commit any offence of similar nature.



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(iv) The petitioner shall co operate for early committal / further proceedings and disposal of the case. The undertaking of the learned counsel for the petitioners that the petitioner will not delay the proceedings by seeking unnecessary adjournments or by deferring cross-examination is recorded, and in case of violation, the trial court / concerned court shall be at liberty to cancel the bail and remand the petitioner to custody if it appears that the delay is deliberate on the part of the petitioner as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji vs. State* (AIR 2005 SCW 5506).

(v) In the event, if the petitioner absconds, a fresh F.I.R shall be registered u/s.269 of BNS.
