ORDER

1. The petitioner / accused has filed a bail application under section 480 of BNSS Act for the alleged offence U/s. 420 of IPC. The petitioner / accused would contended that, he is not guilty of any offence and did not commit the said offence. Further submit that, he was falsely implicated in this case and he is remanded to judicial custody on 27.02.2026 and he is ready to furnish substantial sureties if he released on bail. Therefore he prayed for release on bail U/s 480 of BNSS Act.

2. In this petition reply received from the prosecution and the contention in the reply is that, if the accused is released on bail he will abscond and may not cooperate with trial. Hence, strongly objected to release the accused on bail.

3. Both side heard. On perusal of records, it is found that the petitioner / accused was charged U/s.420 of IPC and remanded to judicial custody on 27.02.2026 and he is in judicial custody for the past 08 days. On perusal of case records, it is clear that the allegations are very serious in nature. If at this stage, the petitioner / accused is released on bail, it would seriously prejudice to the interest of the

prosecution and he may not co-operate with the trial. Hence, considering the facts and circumstances of the case, gravity of the offence, this court is not inclined to grant bail and the bail application deserves no merits, accordingly this petition is dismissed.

In the result this petition is dismissed.
