This petition coming on this day for final hearing before me in the presence of Thiru.K.Chithiraichamy, Advocate for the Petitioner and of Thiru.A.Alagarsamy, Public Prosecutor for the State, after hearing both sides and perusing the written reply submitted by the respondent and records, this court delivers the following . . .

**ORDER:-**

1. This petition has been filed u/s.483(1)(b) of B.N.S.S., to modify the condition imposed by this Court in CrI.M.P.No.157/2026, dated:23.01.2026.

2. The offences alleged are punishable u/s.49A, 49B, 49C, 50, 51 of Wild Life Protection Act, 1972 and amended 2002.

3. It has been stated in the petition that the petitioners have been granted bail by this Court in Cr.M.P.No.157/2026 by order dated:23.01.2026 with a condition that the petitioner shall appear and sign before the Respondent Police Station daily morning at 10.00 a.m., and evening at 05.00 p.m., until further orders, without fail. As per the order of this court, the petitioner is abiding the condition till date. The learned counsel for the petitioner represents that due to his health condition of the petitioner, he could not able to obey the condition imposed by this Court. Hence, the petitioner



had came up with this petition to modify the order imposed on bail by this Court.

4. The learned Public Prosecutor has strongly contended that the investigation is still pending and if the condition is modified, there is a likelihood of the petitioner committing further offences in future. Hence, prays for dismissal of the petition.

5. By considering the submissions of the parties and the fact that there is no satisfactory reasons have been given by the petitioner for modifying the condition. Considering the fact that the alleged offences are in grave nature, this Court is not inclined to allow the petition.

In the result, ***this petition is dismissed.***
