The petition came up for final hearing before me on 13.03.2026 in the presence of Thiru.R.Shiravakumar, B.B.A.,L.L.B., learned Counsel for the Petitioner/Accused person and Assistant Public Prosecutor for the Respondent/Complainant, I made the following.

**ORDER**

1. The petition has been filed by the petitioner U/S. 187 BNSS for seeking statutory bail. The petitioner was alleged to has been committed an offence under Sections 304(2) BNS.

2. The learned Counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner/accused person was falsely implicated without any proper grounds. The petitioner/accused committed robbery of 9 sovereign gold Thali chain belongs to the defacto complainant. Therefore, the case has been registered against the petitioner/accused and other co-accused persons. In the meanwhile, the petitioner/accused person has been arrested and remanded to judicial custody 05.01.2026. The accused persons counsel argued that the

accused person has been in custody for last 72 days and investigation almost completed. Since, the charge sheet yet not filed within the stipulated time prescribed in 187 BNSS, the petitioner/accused person has sought mandatory bail application. It is revealed that the accused person had been in judicial custody for last 72 days from 05.01.2026.

3. On perusal of records, the respondent police has not filed charge sheet within stipulated time of 60 days. Hence, the petitioner/accused person has invoked the mandatory bail application. Accordingly, this court considered the incarceration of accused person and the investigation yet not be completed within the stipulated time. This court concluded that the petitioner is eligible to obtain bail under the provision of sec 187 BNSS. Hence, this court inclines to allow the petition with following conditions.

- (a) That the petitioner/accused person shall execute a bond for Rs.10,000/- before the court with two sureties to the satisfaction of this Hon'ble Court.
- (b) After release, the petitioner shall appear and sign before the respondent police daily once at 10.00 A.M for 30 days.

In the result this petition is allowed.
