The petition coming on this day for final hearing before me in the presence of Thiru. K. G. Balaji, Advocate for the petitioners and Thiru. P. Baskaran, Public Prosecutor for the State, after hearing both sides and perusing the written reply submitted by the respondent and records, this court delivers the following ...

ORDER

The petitioners, who is in judicial custody for the offences charged u/s.191(2), 191(3), 329(4), 296(b), 351(3) BNS, 4 of TNPHW Act and 3 of

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TNPPDL Act in Crime No.274/2026 of the respondent police since 25.03.2026 is seeking for their release on bail u/s.483 of B.N.S.S.,

2. According to the petitioners, they are the accused in the crime number and as against them, allegations have been levelled by the de-facto complainant alleging that there was a prior enmity between the accused persons and one Madhanmohan. The said Madhanmohan was taking treatment in the hospital of the de-facto complainant. At that time, on 23.03.2026 at about 9.30 p.m., the petitioners along with other accused had used filthy language and trespassed into the hospital and threatened the staff members and caused damage to the equipment worth Rs.15,00,000/-. According to the petitioners, they are innocent and they had not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. The petitioners have given undertaking that they would never abscond nor tamper or hamper the witnesses and ready to abide by any condition imposed by the court and willing to produce sufficient solvent sureties to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate. Hence, the petitioners pray for considering their bail application.

3. The respondent filed his detailed objections in writing and the learned Public Prosecutor had submitted that the 2nd petitioner is involved in 01 previous case and the investigation is still pending and in the event, if the

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petitioners are released on bail, they would abscond and may not appear before the court by abiding the condition. They would indulge in similar kind of offence and hence, the Public Prosecutor strongly opposed the grant of bail application to the petitioners.

4. By considering the submissions of the parties and the damages caused to the hospital, a report has been filed by the respondent police to the effect that the same is to the tune of Rs.10,00,000/-. Considering the fact that due to a quarrel between the patient who was taking treatment in the hospital and the accused persons, the petitioners along with others trespassed into the hospital and caused damage to the hospital equipment, this court is not inclined to consider the bail application of the petitioners. Hence this petition is dismissed.

In the result, this petition is dismissed.
