The petition coming on this day for final hearing before me in the presence of Thiru. Sakthivelpandian, Advocate for the petitioner and Thiru. V. Veerasiva, Public Prosecutor for the State, after hearing both sides and perusing the written reply submitted by the respondent and records, this court delivers the following ...

ORDER

The petitioner, who is in judicial custody for the offences charged u/s.8(c), 20(b)(ii)(A), 22(b), 29(1) of NDPS Act and 77 of JJ Act in Crime No.256/2026 of the respondent police since 20.06.2026 is seeking for his release on bail u/s.483 of B.N.S.S.,

2. This is an application for bail in respect of a case registered against the petitioner/accused u/s.8(c), 20(b)(ii)(A), 22(b), 29(1) of NDPS Act and 77 of JJ Act.



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3. The learned counsel for the accused submits that the accused is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence. If he is enlarged on bail, he would furnish sufficient sureties.

4. The prosecution is given notice. The learned Public Prosecutor strongly objected to release the accused on the ground that the investigation is not yet completed and he is already involved in one previous case of a similar nature.

5. Having regard to the submissions of the respective sides, the occurrence has taken place on 20.06.2026. The accused is in custody from the same date. As per the case of the prosecution, the accused along with other accused were found to be in possession of 37 grams of ganja and 32 intoxicating tablets. A cursory perusal of the reply given by the learned Public Prosecutor would go to show that the accused is involved in a previous case of a similar nature in Crime No.222/2026 on the file of Rajathani Police Station. It is further noticed that the accused persons were selling narcotic substances to young adolescent children. Considering the gravity of the allegations, particularly the adverse impact of such activities on the younger generation, the involvement of the accused in a previous case of a similar nature and the stage of investigation and also this is the 2nd bail application filed by the petitioner and the earlier application was dismissed in CrI.M.P.No.1135/2026 dated 30.06.2026, the present bail application has been filed without any change in circumstances warranting reconsideration. Thereby, this court is not inclined to grant bail to the accused at this stage. Accordingly, the petition is dismissed.
