This case came up on 10.03.2026 for final hearing before me in the presence of Gr.I. A.P.P. for the state and the Learned Counsel **Mr.R. Balamurugan**, for the accused 1 and 2, and on hearing both sides, upon perusing the records and having stood over for consideration till this day, this court delivers the following:

**JUDGMENT ON ADMISSION**

1. The Complaint was filed under Section 59(1) of Food Safety and Standard Act, 2006 against the accused.

2. After taking cognizance. The case was taken on file against both the accused for the offences under section 59(1) of Food Safety Standards Act and issued summons to the accused.

3. After the appearance of accused before this Court, the copies of the documents proposed to be relied upon by the prosecution were furnished to the accused under Section 207 of Cr.P.C at free of cost and after sufficient time was given and when questioned regarding the offence alleged for which they admitted their guilty.

4. The accused pleaded guilty on their own accord and filed the admission petition, the material records of the case were perused and thereby this court came to

conclusion that the accused have committed the offence under section 59(1) of Food Safety Standards Act.

5. The accused was found guilty and questioned regarding the sentence to be awarded upon them, the accused had stated that they belongs to a poor family and they are the only bread winner of their family and they are working for the past several years without any violation of the Act and sought for the lower punishment.

6. In the result, on careful consideration of the plea of the accused, the nature and the circumstances of the case

i) the accused 1 and 2 are found guilty and thereby convicted under section 248(2) of Crpc for the offence u/s.59(1) of Food Safety Standards Act and sentenced to undergo imprisonment till the rising of the court and pay fine for a sum of Rs.10,000/- each (Ten thousand only) for the offence under section 59(1) of Food Safety Standards Act. In default to pay of fine, they shall undergo 1 week simple imprisonment.

7. No property had been remanded in this case. Hence, no property order.
