This petition came for hearing on this day in the presence of Tmt.B.Thingalaval, Deputy Legal Aid Defence Counsel for the petitioner and Thiru.S.Kanagasabapathy, Public Prosecutor for the State / respondent, after hearing both sides and on perusing the Reply submitted by the Respondent and the Records, this Court delivers the following:

ORDER

The Petitioner has filed the application U/s.483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking bail for the offence u/s.123 r/w.110 of BNS in Crime No.17/2026 of the respondent police.

First Information Report is pending against the petitioner u/s.123 r/w.110 of BNS. The alleged date of occurrence is on 08.01.2026 and the

First Information Report was registered on 09.01.2026 and the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on the very same day and she is in incarceration for **past 152 days**.

The learned Counsel appearing for the petitioner would contend that the petitioner is innocent and has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution.

In contra, the learned Public Prosecutor would raise objection through a report of concern police by stating that the petitioner along with co-accused alleged to have possessed 60 number of Tapentadol tablets in order to sell the same to public at large to make an unlawful gain through illegal means and hence, sought to dismiss the application.

Both side heard. Records perused. The alleged date of occurrence is on 08.01.2026 and the First Information Report was registered on 09.01.2026 and the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on the very same day and she is in incarceration for **past 152 days**. As per the report of concern police, the petitioner is involved in two other previous case of similar nature and the investigation is in progress. The earlier applications seeking bail sought by the petitioner were already dismissed by the Hon'ble High Court, Madras vide order in Crl.O.P.No.2637/2026, dated: 05.02.2026 and Crl.O.P.No.5340 / 2026, dated: 03.03.2026 and bail sought by the petitioner was dismissed by this court vide order in Crl.M.P.No.552/2026, dated:13.03.2026 and there is no change in circumstances in between the orders of dismissal of bail sought

by the petitioner by this court and the Hon'ble High Court of Madras and the petition under order.

By considering the facts and circumstances, nature and gravity of offence, stage of investigation, quantity of banned tobacco products involved in the offence, dismissal of bail sought by the petitioner by the Hon'ble High Court of Madras and by this court, antecedent of the petitioner and the interest of society at large, this Court is **not inclined** to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

In the result, this petition is **dismissed**.
