This petition came for hearing on this day in the presence of Thiru.A.Subhash Arjun, Counsel for the petitioner and Thiru.A.Sachignanandakumar, Public Prosecutor for the State / respondent, after hearing both sides and on perusing the reply submitted by the respondent in writing and the records, this Court delivers the following:

ORDER

The Petitioner has filed the application U/s.483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking bail for the offences u/s.294(b), 324, 506(1) of IPC in Cr.No.1665/2021 of the respondent police.

It is the case of the prosecution that, on the date of occurrence, due to a wordy quarrel between the petitioner and the defacto complainant, the petitioner abused the defacto complainant, pelted a stone in causing a life

threat and on execution of a non bailable warrant issued against the petitioner, he was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 05.07.2026.

The learned petitioner Counsel argued that, the case against the petitioner was taken on the file of the Judicial Magistrate, Palladam as C.C. No.131/2023 and the petitioner is in judicial custody for the past 77 days, the case is at the stage of trial and so the petitioner may be granted bail.

The learned Public Prosecutor per contra argued that, it is a case of jumped out of bail, if the petitioner is granted with bail, he may again abscond and tamper the witnesses and so, he has strong objection in granting bail to the petitioner.

The above rival contention of both sides are considered and records are perused. It is a case of jumped out of bail and the petitioner is in judicial custody for the past 77 days on execution of NBW issued by the Judicial Magistrate Court, Palladam in CC.No.131/2023 and considering that the said case is now at trial stage, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with the following conditions :-

In the result, the petitioner/accused is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate Court, Palladam** and on further condition that;

- 1) after getting released the petitioner shall appear and sign before the respondent police daily once at 09.00 a.m. for 30 days.
- 2) the petitioner shall not tamper the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial,

3) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial and

4) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by it as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560].

Accordingly, this petition is allowed.
