This case having coming up on 09.03.2026 for hearing before me in the presence of Tmt.Hema, B.A., B.L., Assistant Public Prosecutor, Grade II. Upon perusing the connected material records and having stood over till this day for consideration, this court delivers the following.

JUDGMENT

This case has been taken on file on the basis of the final report filed by the Sub Inspector of Police for the offences punishable under the relevant provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023. Both the accused appeared before this Court and copies of documents were furnished to them under Section 207 Cr.P.C./BNSS.

Upon perusal of the materials and hearing both sides, charges were framed against the accused, namely, against A1 Megala for the offences under Sections 115(2) and 351(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 and against A2 Anandakrishnan for the offences under Sections 118(1) and 296(b) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, and the same were read over and explained to them in a language known to them and they understood the same.

At this stage, both the accused filed an admission petition and the same was allowed. The accused voluntarily admitted the charges and pleaded guilty and their plea was recorded. In view of the voluntary and unequivocal plea of guilt, this Court finds A1 Megala guilty for the offences under Sections 115(2) and 351(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 and A2 Anandakrishnan guilty for the offences under Sections 118(1) and 296(b) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

After recording the finding of guilt, the accused were questioned on the quantum of sentence and they pleaded for leniency. Considering the nature of the offences, the circumstances of the case, the absence of previous criminal antecedents and the possibility of reformation, this Court is of the view that the accused deserve an opportunity to reform.

Accordingly, invoking the provisions under Section 4 of the Probation of Offenders Act, 1958, the accused Megala (A1) and Anandakrishnan (A2) are released on probation of good conduct for a period of one year on each of them executing a bond for Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only), undertaking to

maintain peace and good behaviour during the said period and to appear before this Court and receive sentence when called upon to do so, and during the probation period, the accused shall appear before the Probation Officer as and when required and comply with the directions issued by the Probation Officer, failing which they shall be liable to be called upon to receive sentence in accordance with law.

The properties in PR.No.75/2025 is ordered to be destroyed.
