This is a petition filed by the petitioner u/s.483 of BNSS., seeking bail.

This petition coming on for final hearing before me today in the presence of Thiru.K.Balakrishnan, Legal Aid Defense Counsels for the petitioner and of Thiru.R.Madialagan, Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and upon hearing the arguments of both sides and having stood over for consideration till this date, this Court has passed the following ...

ORDER

Heard both sides.

The petitioner/accused is seeking bail for the offences alleged to have been committed by him u/s 103(1) of BNS Act concerned in Cr.No.3/2026 of Patteeswaram P.S.

The learned counsel for the petitioner/accused submits that in fact this petitioner is no way connected with the alleged offence and she has been falsely

implicated in this case. Charge sheet has been filed. This petitioner is in judicial custody since 14.03.2026. He prays to release her on bail.

The learned Public Prosecutor submits that the petitioner is the sole accused in this case. He states that due to the matrimonial dispute, the petitioner deserted her husband and she was living along with her son Saivignesh for the past five years and while so, on 26.02.2026, at about 11.00 Hours, she made a quarrel with her husband over phone and on 27.02.2026, she told her son that she would commit suicide and her son asked to kill him and therefore, on 27.02.2026 at about 3.00 PM, she hanged her son, which resulted in his death and she attempted to commit suicide by making cut injury near her left wrist. No previous case is pending against the petitioner. He states that if the petitioner is released on bail, it would cause prejudice to the further proceedings of the case and hence, he objected to release her on bail.

It is seen that on account of matrimonial dispute, the petitioner deserted her husband and living along with her son and on 27.02.2026 at about 3.00 PM, she hanged her son, which resulted in his death and she attempted to commit suicide by making cut injury near her left wrist. The petitioner has no previous case.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of the offence and considering that if the petitioner is released on bail, she would tamper the evidences, I am of the view that granting bail to this petitioner would cause prejudice to the further proceedings of the case and there is every possibility of abscondance and hence, I am not inclined to allow this petition.

In the result, this petition is dismissed.
