This petition is coming before me on this day for hearing in the presence of Thiru.D.Ravi, Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner and Thiru. K.V.Manoharan, Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and after hearing either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

Petition for Anticipatory bail

The petitioner/A1 has filed this petition under section 482 of BNSS Act, praying to grant Anticipatory bail to him for the alleged offences punishable under sections, 82(1), 85, 351(2) of BNS in Cr.No. 81/2025 of **Tiruvannamalai AWPS**.

Heard Both sides. Records perused.

The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner/Accused would contend that the petitioner/accused is an innocent person and he is noway connected with the above alleged offences, already the interim anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioner, and also the absolute Anticipatory bail was granted to other accused, the petitioner having a permanent residence and also ready to abide any condition imposed by this court, hence prayed to enlarge the petitioner on **absolute** anticipatory bail.

The Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State submitted that the petitioner/accused is the husband of the defacto complainant, he caused cruelty to the defacto complainant and cheated her and also got second marriage, petitioner and also threatened her and the investigation has not been completed, already the interim

anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioner and the Absolute Anticipatory Bail was granted to other accused.

At the time of hearing the Extension of Interim Anticipatory Bail Application, the defacto complainant alongwith her female child and the petitioner appeared before this Court. The leaned counsel appearing for the petitioner filed an affidavit stating that since he is earning meagre of Rs.12,000/- from his job, hence he is not able to pay a huge amount towards the maintenance. However, he voluntarily submitted in the Affidavit that he is ready to pay a sum of Rs.7,000/- per month towards the maintenance to the defacto complainant/wife and his female daughter. Hence considering the affidavit filed by the petitioner and the plight of the defaco complainant and female child, this Court deem appropriate to modify the quantum of maintenance of Rs.15,000/-that already ordered by this Court as Rs.7,000/- as requested by the petitioner herein. Thus, the petitioner as per his request hereby ordered to pay a sum of Rs.7,000/-per month towards the maintenance to his wife and daughter.

With the above stipulation, this Court is inclined to grant an Absolute Anticipatory Bail to the petitioner. In the event of any failure on the part of the petitioner in paying the maintenance as ordered by this Court on the request of the petitioner, it is left opened to the defacto complainant to file a necessary application to cancel the Anticipatory bail granted to the petitioner.

In the result, this Anticipatory Bail Petition is allowed with the following conditions:

1) The petitioner/Accused is hereby directed to pay a sum of **Rs.7,000/-** (Rupees Seven thousand only) (every month within 10th day of English Calender Month without fail) to the defacto complainant. **(In the event of any failure on the part of the petitioner in paying the maintenance as ordered by this Court on the request of the petitioner, it is left opened to the defacto complainant to file a necessary application to cancel the Anticipatory bail granted to the petitioner).**

2) The Petitioner/Accused is ordered to be enlarged on bail in the event of arrest or on appearance before the Jurisdictional Magistrate, within a period of 15 days from today and on his executing an own bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousands only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Jurisdictional Magistrate.

3) The petitioner should not tamper any witness, he should cooperate with the investigation, he should not make any undue influence on the witnesses, he should not indulge in any other offence in future and not to leave the station either to abroad or other State without permission of this Court.
