This petition is coming before me on this day for hearing in the presence of Thiru.R.Dhandapani, Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner and Thiru. K.V.Manoharan, Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and after hearing either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

The petitioner/Accused has filed this petition under section 483 of BNSS praying to grant bail to them for the alleged offences punishable under sections 420 of IPC, 66(D) of I.T. Act in Cr.No.2/2026 of Cyber Crime Branch Police CCW, Tiruvannamalai.

Heard Both sides. Records perused.

The Learned Counsel appearing for the Petitioner/Accused contended that the petitioner had not committed any offence as alleged and he has been falsely implicated in this case, and he is in judicial custody from 06.02.2026, the petitioner is having permanent residence and also ready to abide any condition imposed by this court and hence, prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

The Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State submitted that the petitioner/accused had cheated the defacto complainant by making forged getting job in an I.T. Company, Bangalore by receiving huge amount from the defacto complainant and also one more previous cases to the credit of the petitioner and the investigation has not been completed, and hence opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

At the time of hearing the bail application, the defacto complainant, parents of the petitioner and the police were present. The police identified the defacto complainant and the parents of the petitioner herein. The counsel appearing for the petitioner filed an affidavit given by the petitioner and attested by the Jailor, Central Prison Salem wherein the petitioner herein admitted the fact of receiving a sum of Rs.6,00,000/- from the defacto complainant on the assurance of getting job for the latter Information Technology, Bangalore and he has further admitted the fact that out of Rs.6,00,000/-, he has already been settled a sum of Rs.2,00,000/- and today through his parents has settled a sum of Rs.2,00,000/- to the defacto complainant and rest the sum of Rs.2,00,000/- after releasing him on bail. and has further stated that the mother of the petitioner has issued a cheque leaves drawn in Bank of Baroda Cheque No.000005 and 000006 as the security for the payment of rest of Rs.2,00,000/- by the petitioner herein.

The defacto complainant present and also confirmed the averments found in the affidavit filed by the petitioner herein and he also filed an affidavit stating that out of Rs.6,00,000/- given by him to the petitioner as of that he has received a sum of Rs.4,00,000/- only and rest of Rs.2,00,000/- alone to be paid by the petitioner and has further stated that he has no serious objection to grant bail to the petitioner as the latter has agreed to settle the rest of Rs. 2,00,000/- to him. Hence, having considered the submission of the learned public prosecutor, and the learned Counsel appearing for the petitioner, and the defacto complainant as well as the affidavit filed by the respective parties, this Court deem appropriate to consider the bail application with the following condition; the petitioner shall settle the rest of the amount of Rs.2,00,000/- to the defacto complainant on or before 07.05.2026.

In the event of failure on the part of the petitioner in payment of rest of amount as agreed, the defacto complainant is entitled to file a cancellation of bail.

With the above stipulation, this court is inclined to grant Bail to the petitioner.

In the result, this Bail Petition is allowed with the following conditions:

1) **The petitioner/Accused shall settle the rest of the amount of Rs.2,00,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs only) to the defacto complainant on or before 07.05.2026.**

(2) the Petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousands Only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Jurisdictional Magistrate.

(3) The Petitioner is directed to report before the **Cyber Crime Branch, Salem daily(except court holidays)** at 10.00 A.M. for a period of 15 days from the date of his release without fail.

4) The Petitioner shall not tamper any witness, he should co-operate with the investigation, he should not make any undue influence on the witnesses, he should not indulge in any other offence in future and not to leave the station either to abroad or other State without permission of this Court.
