This petition is coming before me on this day for hearing in the presence of Thiru.R.Kanishkar, Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner and Thiru. K.V.Manoharan, Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and after hearing either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

Petition for Bail.

The petitioners/Accused have filed this petition under section 483 of BNSS, prays to grant bail to them for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 303(2), 326(a) of BNS r/w Section 21(5) of M.M. Act in Cr.No.17/2026 of Brammadesam Police Station.

Heard Both sides. Records perused.

The Learned Counsel appearing for the Petitioners/Accused would contend that the petitioners are innocent persons and they are noway connected with the above alleged offences, and they have been falsely implicated in this case, the petitioners are in judicial custody from 4.3.2026, the investigation is almost over, the petitioners are ready to abide any condition imposed by this court, the petitioners are hereby undertake that they will not abscond and will not tamper any witness and hence prayed to grant bail to the petitioners.

The Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State submitted that the petitioners/accused had illegally transported the each two bags sand using their two-wheelers without valid prior permission from the concerned authorities and no previous cases are pending as against the petitioners, no previous case is pending as against the petitioner, the investigation is pending and hence, opposed to enlarge the petitioners on bail.

Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of the offence, period of incarceration, (9 days), **and the fact of first time offenders of this case**, completion of material portion of investigation, and in the absence of any strong objection, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners.

In the result, this Bail Petition is allowed with the following conditions:

(1) The Petitioners are ordered to be enlarged on bail on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- each (Rupees Ten Thousands Only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Jurisdictional Magistrate.

(2) The Petitioners are directed to report before the learned **Judicial Magistrate Polur daily(except court holidays)** at 10.00 A.M. for a period of 15 days from the date of their release without fail.

3) The Petitioners shall not tamper any witness, they should co-operate with the investigation, they should not make any undue influence on the witnesses, they should not indulge in any other offence in future and not to leave the station either to abroad or other State without permission of this Court.
