This petition is coming before me on this day for hearing in the presence of Thiru.A.Azaruddin, Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner and Thiru. K.V.Manoharan, Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and after hearing either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

Petition for Anticipatory bail

The petitioner/Accused has filed this petition under section 482 of BNSS. prays to enlarge him on anticipatory bail for the alleged offences punishable u/s. 296(b), 189(2), 191(2), 351(2), 353(1)(b) of BNS **in Cr.No.51/2026 of Kadaladi Police Station.**

Heard Both sides. Records perused.

The Learned Counsel appearing for the Petitioner/Accused contended that the petitioner has not committed any offence as alleged and he has been falsely implicated in this case, the complaint is false, the investigation is almost over, he is having permanent residence and also ready to abide any condition imposed by this court and hence, prayed to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

The Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State submitted that the petitioner/accused abused the defacto complainant in filthy language, also threatened with dire consequences, and the investigation has been completed. Hence opposed to grant Anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of dispute over the entering into the temple premises beyond the permitted hours and the coaccused has already been released on bail, completion of material portion of investigation, in the absence of strong objection raised on the side of prosecution, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

In the result, this Anticipatory Bail Petition is allowed with the following conditions:

1. The Petitioner/Accused is ordered to be enlarged on bail in the event of arrest or on appearance before the Jurisdictional Magistrate, within a period of 15 days from today and on his executing an own bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousands only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Jurisdictional Magistrate.

2. The petitioner/Accused is directed to report before the **learned Judicial Magistrate Kalasapakkam** (Except court holidays) daily at **10.30 am**, for a period of 15 days from the date of compliance of this order without fail.

3. The petitioner should not tamper any witness, he should cooperate with the investigation, he should not make any undue influence on the witnesses, he should not indulge in any other offence in future and not to leave the station either to abroad or other State without permission of this Court.
